Accomplishments:

1. A document outlining intention of use of UWH Development Fund established. This document includes distribution percentages towards categories incoming funds will generally be placed.
2. Four teams and three referees represented the USA at Worlds in Gold Coast Australia. The Men's Masters took first place, Women's Masters took fourth, Men's Elite took tenth, and Women's Elite took seventh. Rosa achieved a 2-star rating for her reffing.
3. USOA UWH Referee Training has received substantial revamping. Basic Referee and Level 1 exams are now available to be conducted virtually. We anticipate seeing more individuals taking these courses and advancing through the levels over the next year.
4. As of the September meeting, the committee seats will be full for the first time since 2020.
