ARLINGTON ISD – WEEK TWO PREVIEW

Mansfield Tigers (0-1) vs. Bowie Volunteers (1-0)

1 p.m. Saturday, The Cotton Bowl in Dallas

THE SERIES: The Volunteers lead the series, 7-6, and have won five of the last seven. The will be the first meeting – and Bowie’s first appearance – at the Cotton Bowl.

LAST WEEK: Mansfield hosted Broken Arrow (Okla.) and wound up on the wrong end of a 42-13 score. Bowie hosted Flower Mound Marcus and won, 28-14.

DETECTING A TREND: Mansfield has won 11 of its last 12 games against Arlington ISD teams. Bowie’s win last year snapped an 11-game Tiger winning streak against the AISD.

Byron Nelson Bobcats (0-1) at Arlington Colts (1-0)

7 pm Friday, UT Arlington’s Maverick Stadium

THE SERIES: The Colts, who are celebrating Homecoming this week, won the only previous meeting, 37-34, last season at Northwest ISD Stadium.

LAST WEEK: Arlington downed Dallas Jesuit, 38-21, while Byron Nelson was edged by Lamar, 28-27.

AIR RAID! Arlington’s Charles Brown tied two AISD records last week in the win over Jesuit. Brown hauled in a 99-yard touchdown from Kris Sims, equaling the city record set by Martin’s Eric Walker and Cortlandt Brooks against Amarillo in 2015. Brown also tied a city record with four touchdown receptions in the game, matching the record of Arlington’s Rashad Anderson against Plano East in 2016, and Lamar’s Trevon West against Martin last year.

Garland Naaman Forest Rangers (0-1) at Lamar Vikings (1-0)

7 p.m. Friday, Cravens Field

THE SERIES: Lamar leads the series, winning the only previous meeting, 20-0, at Garland’s Williams Stadium last year.

LAST WEEK: Lamar slipped past Byron Nelson last week, 28-27, while Naaman Forest was thrashed by McKinney Boyd, 45-7.

CATCHING ON: Lamar has won its last six games at Cravens Field.

Martin Warriors (0-1) at Hebron Hawks (1-0)

7 p.m. Thursday, UT Arlington's Maverick Stadium

THE SERIES: The Hawks lead the series, pinning a 63-24 loss on Martin last year at Hawk Stadium. This will be the first meeting at Maverick Stadium.

LAST WEEK: Martin went down to Austin and paid back Lake Travis for last year by an identical score of 35-14, while Hebron thrashed Plano, 53-26.

FAST START: Martin junior quarterback Zach Mundell got off to a fast start last week, gaining 174 yards on the ground and 69 more in the air. Mundell accounted for four of the five Warrior touchdowns.

Lewisville Farmers (1-0) at Sam Houston Texans (1-0)

7:30 p.m. Friday, Lewisville's Goldsmith Stadium

THE SERIES: The series is tied at 1-1, with the Texans taking a 46-27 victory over the Farmers in 1991, and Lewisville edging Sam Houston, 14-13, last year at Lewisville's Goldsmith Stadium.

LAST WEEK: The Texans edged North Mesquite, 21-17, in their opener, while Lewisville smashed Grand Prairie, 34-3.

EVENING THE RECORD: A win this week (and it is Homecoming at Sam Houston) would make the Texans 2-0 for the first time since 2014.

Mansfield Summit Jaguars (1-0) at Juan Seguin Cougars (0-1)

7 p.m. Thursday, Wilemon Field

THE SERIES: The Jaguars lead the series, 5-1, but only hold a 2-1 edge at Wilemon Field.

LAST WEEK: Seguin absorbed a 32-21 beating from Garland Lakeview, while Summit easily handled Sand Springs Page (Okla.), 41-7 at Vernon Newsom Stadium.

KICKING OFF THE SEASON: Seguin is trying to avoid its second straight 0-2 start.
