I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The **21st Annual Skate in the Park Competition** will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the [current rulebook](#), and/or [current Compete USA handbook](#) as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating [website](#).

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, Learn to Skate USA® member, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the [rulebook](#) for more information.

SERIES INFORMATION: Skate in the Park is part of the Twin Cities Figure Skating Association Compete USA Series. See the Twin Cities Figure Skating Association website for more information including eligibility and point system details.

II. ELIGIBILITY

Singles: Excel and Well-Balanced Events:

- Skaters must meet at least the minimum singles test requirements for the event's level. A skater's singles test level may be higher than the minimum requirement.
 - o Skate Up: skaters may skate up one level higher than their minimum test requirement allows.
- Skaters may not register for an event level lower than allowed by their competitive floor. An athlete's competitive floor is set by one of the following scenarios:
 - o If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the NQS series, the event level registered for in the most recent NQS will become the lowest level they may compete at in any U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event.
 - o If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the Excel Series, the event level registered for in the most recent Excel series will become the lowest level they may compete in any Excel event. For Well-Balanced and Specialty events the skater will be permitted to register at one level lower than the "floor" set by their excel series entry.
 - o If an athlete has never had a paid EMS series application in the NQS or Excel series, the athlete may select their level based on their goals and technical skills as long as the minimum test requirements are met.
- Skaters are not permitted to enter an Excel free skate and a Well-Balanced free skate event at the same competition (example: Juvenile Girls Free Skate and Juvenile Girls Excel Free Skate). However, they are permitted to enter an Excel and a Well-Balanced event of different types such as a short program (if stand-alone event option), specialty or showcase events (example: Intermediate Women Short Program and Intermediate Women Excel Free Skate).

COACHES

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into two categories, Coach Compliance (includes choreographers) and Learn to Skate USA® Instructor Compliance. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found in [Members Only](#), click the blue “COACH” button. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

Coaches of foreign athletes: If you are a coach of a foreign athlete only, you are not subject to U.S. Figure Skating coach compliance and will only be asked to provide a letter of good standing for the federation your athlete represents.

One coach credential per registered athlete.

MANDATORY ATHLETES

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSport™ Training. *

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport™ Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email skatesafe@usfigureskating.org for instructions or questions regarding parental consent.

III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

ENTRIES:

Fees will be as follows:

- IJS Events: \$150.00 for the first event and \$45.00 for each additional event (IJS/6.0/CJS).
- 6.0 & CJS Events: \$130.00 for the first event and \$45.00 for each additional event.
- Compete USA Basic Skills events will be \$100.00 for the first event and \$30.00 for each additional event.

In the event that a skater is signed up for the incorrect level or event, the Chief Referee must approve all changes. An additional fee of \$25.00 will be charged to the skater if the Referee approves any changes. Late entries will be accepted only at the discretion of the Chief Referee and must be accompanied by a \$25.00 late fee.

ONLINE registration is the only method available for all events for the Skate in the Park Competition; powered by EntryEeze with a link at -

Secure Online Registration and credit card payment is available on EntryEeze.

Deadline for registration is 01/11/2026 11:59pm.

When registering online, please indicate if skater would want to skate or be issued a refund if they are the only skater in the event. Skaters will not be allowed to practice or compete until all financial obligations are met.

Upon receiving your application online an email will be sent to the skater's coach to verify accuracy of entry. An official at the skater's home club will also be notified to certify the skater's good standing within the club.

The competition committee and/or the referee reserves the right to cancel or combine any event(s) or to limit entries because of time constraints. Skaters will be notified if their event is cancelled or combined.

TEST CREDIT:

Skaters that meet the requirements for test credit may purchase their test credit forms online with their registration (go to your competition tab and then merchandise). The cost of the form packet is \$20.00. Forms will be emailed to the competitor for submission to the competitor's home club. Any athlete seeking IJS Test Credit is responsible for all steps outlined in the "For Athletes" section of the [IJS Protocol for Test Credit](#) document. This includes submitting your Test Credit Packet and coach statement to your club for official processing within the permissible timeline.

MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD:

ALL SKATERS MUST SUBMIT MUSIC ELECTRONICALLY VIA ENTRYEEZE.

Competition music for all events that require music must be submitted electronically via EntryEeze by the music deadline of **February 8, 2026 11:59 pm**.

Any music files submitted through EntryEeze after the deadline will incur a \$20 fee.

After you have paid for your events, the system will prompt you to upload your music for each event that requires music. If your music is not available at that time, you can logout of your account and return later to upload your music by going to the "competition" tab and then selecting "my music".

All music must meet the following criteria. If you have questions about what format you have, please contact your coach, and get a new version of your music that meets the criteria listed below.

MUSIC CRITERIA:

- File Format: MP3
- Leaders and trailers (the silence or "dead space" before and after the actual start and end of the program music) may not exceed two (2) seconds. We prefer that there be NO leaders or trailers at all. Excessive leaders and trailers may disrupt the playing of the music during competition.

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone, and it must be immediately available rink side whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, the phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) SUBMISSION/UPLOAD – FOR IJS EVENTS ONLY:

Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in EntryEeze no later than **February 8, 2026 11:59 pm**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EntryEeze and **subject to a \$20 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who does not meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

REFUND POLICY

Entry fees will not be refunded after the entry deadline, **1/11/2026**, unless no competition exists or the event is cancelled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals including for COVID-19 quarantine requirements. The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a processing fee. Payment of fees will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

U.S. Figure Skating, Learn to Skate USA®, Three Rivers Figure Skating Club and Brooklyn Park Community Activity Center accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS

FACILITIES:

[Brooklyn Park Community Activity Center](#) - 5600 85th Ave North, Brooklyn Park MN

- Both sheets of ice are 200 ft x 85 ft.
- Admission to the competition is free
- Bleacher seating is available
- At the time of publishing the announcement and subject to change are the following:
 - Two rinks will be used for the competition
 - There will be a coach's hospitality room
 - There will be concessions open for purchase in Rink 1

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS:

Suggested verbiage: Locker rooms and changing areas will not be available this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive at the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc.). Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on but changing will not be permitted in these spaces.

U.S. Figure Skating Travel Policy:

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors who are at least 8 years of age or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). OFFICIAL WEBSITE & UPDATES:

RESULTS

Official Results will be posted using Live Results. A link will be shared on the EntryEeze site as well as

the Three Rivers Figure Skating Club competition site. Results will NOT be posted on paper at the event.

SCHEDULE

Competitors may be scheduled any time during the announced date of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

PRACTICE ICE:

Practice ice will be available for purchase via EntryEeze or at the Registration desk.

- Pre-paid practice ice is being offered to skaters for a cost of \$18.00 per 20-minute session.
- No skaters music is played during the practice ice sessions.
- Practice ice will be available on both Rink 1 and Rink 2 in the morning before the competition events begin. There will be no practice ice after the events start.
- There are no level restrictions on any practice ice sessions.
- Skaters will be able to choose their own practice ice sessions online after practice ice selection opens on EntryEeze, but will need to indicate the number of sessions desired during the registration process and must be pre-paid with your entry.
- Additional practice ice will be available to purchase for \$22.00 per session once the schedule has been posted and those skaters who have pre-registered for practice ice have had time to make their selections.
- Practice ice will also be available to purchase at the registration desk the day of the competition for \$25.00 per session.
- Refunds will not be given for unused practice ice sessions.

ONSITE CHECK-IN:

- The competition registration desk will be open at The Brooklyn Park Community Activity Center at least 30 minutes prior to and during all scheduled practices and events.
- All notices, schedule changes and/or additional important information will be posted on EntryEeze and the Three Rivers Figure Skating Club website.

AWARDS:

Awards will be presented to **ALL** competitors in each event. Awards should be picked up from the Awards Table after each event. Skaters will initial the results sheet and can take personal pictures in the Photo Area. There will not be professional awards photos this year.

PHOTO/VIDEO:

No FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY is allowed in the rink area during competition. Videos will be provided by Perkins Media. Registration fees for individual registrants include a FREE video from a single event of your choice compliments of the Three Rivers Figure Skating Club. Additional videos will be available for purchase through Perkins Media.

Note, per U.S. Figure Skating policy, photographing and/or recording of any event other than your own skater is strictly prohibited.
