Provincial Championship Performance Bond

The performance bond for all Baseball BC Provincial Championships is \$2 000. This is capped at \$5 000 per association/program.

The following process will be followed for the collection of performance bonds from each member's teams.

PBL & BC Minor & Little League

The member (PBL/BC Minor/Little League) will underwrite the performance bonds for all of their teams entered. Should a team forfeit any portion of their performance bond, the member will be invoiced by Baseball BC and will be responsible for collecting from their own team.

Babe Ruth

Individual teams will submit their performance bond directly to Baseball BC one month prior to the Provincial Championship.

Fees for Westerns & Nationals

Westerns - In-Province

Members \$100 per player & coach (does not apply to host team)

Westerns – Out of Province

Members \$300 per player & coach

Baseball BC will cover airfare costs to all out of province Western Canada Championships for any member or non-member team who qualifies. Teams and players are responsible for their own hotels, meals, and local transportation.

Nationals

Members \$500 per player & coach (does not apply to host team)

Baseball BC will cover airfare costs to all out of province National Championships for any member or non-member team who qualifies. Baseball BC will pay the \$4 000 Baseball Canada accommodation fee for the event in addition to hotel costs for the Tuesday night if required. Teams/players are responsible for their own meals.

Baseball BC will book flights for 21 individuals for all out of province tournaments. Should a team not require this number of flights for players and coaches they will be required to pay the full cost of unused flights, which can be resold to parents. The full cost is defined as what Baseball BC paid for the flight, not the subsidized fee above.

All fees for Westerns and Nationals are payable to Baseball BC within five days of qualification. Baseball BC will select and provide funding for the Chef de Mission at National Championships where one is required.

Teams may BC uniforms at National Championships. The team is responsible for ordering and all costs. Teams must wear club uniforms at all Westerns.

Team & Player Eligibility - All Leagues & Divisions

Players must meet the Baseball Canada age requirements for their division. No overage players are permitted for any reason except where provided for female athletes.

All out of catchment players must have been approved by the member (Little League, PBL, Babe Ruth, BC Minor) and be permitted under their own transfer rules.

Teams may not add players who have not been part of their local association or club during the spring season per their members rules unless modified in this document.

Unless modified in this document, Baseball BC generally follows a member's own rules to determine the eligibility of athletes and teams.

Roster Rules

18U AAA Tier 1 & 2 Rosters are due on Monday July 27th. The rosters for all other divisions are due on Monday August 3rd.

Rosters must comply with rules specific to each member league (see sections below).

The only changes to rosters after submission will be due to injury or other special circumstances prior to the start of the event.

If teams have concerns about the eligibility of athletes on a roster, they are strongly encouraged to immediately bring them to the attention of Baseball BC well in advance of a Provincial. While Baseball BC will review eligibility concerns at any time, generally it takes time to investigate, so it may not be possible to address all issues identified during the event. Games will not be retroactively forfeited due to a player being found to be ineligible unless Baseball BC determines a deliberately falsification of information has occurred.

Baseball BC will provide a roster form. Teams may submit rosters on other league forms provided that the roster includes: first/last name, birthdate, and address, and NCCP numbers for all coaches.

Players are permitted to play in multiple Provincial Championships provided the championships are on different weekends. Players must be eligible under PBL rules to play in the division and for the team they are rostered with for participation in a Baseball BC Provincial Championship. Such PBL rules may include but are not limited to: limits to the number of games played at a higher level, minimum participation levels, and release procedures.

Programs may create a roster of any combination of players from within their program (SR, JR, 15U).

18U AAA Tier 2

Programs may create a roster of any combination of players from their Junior or 15U teams.

PBL 15U AAA teams are not able to add pick-ups to their PBL regular season roster. Teams with extended, flexible, rosters of more than 16 players, or programs who have a second team not playing in the league, may select any 16 of these players on their final roster.

Team & Player Eligibility

BC Minor Specific

Players must be eligible under BC Minor rules to play in the division and for the team they are rostered with for participation in a Baseball BC Provincial Championship. Such BC Minor rules may include but are not limited to: limits to the number of games played at a higher level, minimum participation levels, and release procedures.

Exceptions to BC Minor eligibility rules are as follows:

18U AAA Tier 1

BC Minor College Prep teams may create a roster of any combination of players from within their program (18U CP, 18U AAA, 18U AA, 15U.)

18U AAA Tier 2

BC Minor 18U AAA teams may create a roster of any combination of players from within their program except that players rostered at College Prep are not eligible.

All Other Divisions

Teams may add pick-ups from a lower division to their roster by the submission deadline. For example, a 15U AA team may add a player from 15U A or from 13U. Teams may not cut players from their roster for the purpose of adding pickups.

Players must be eligible under Little League rules to play in the division and for the team they are rostered with for participation in a Baseball BC Provincial Championship. Such Little League rules may include but are not limited to: limits to the number of games played at a higher level, minimum participation levels, and release procedures. Little League age eligibility is based on the actual age of the athlete and not the division they participated in during the season.

15U AA

An Association may choose to enter a team, consisting of players who reside within their boundaries. A District may apply to Baseball BC to field a team, consisting of any combination of players from within their District's boundaries. These applications must be received with their registration form by June 15th. Baseball BC will consider such applications on a case by case basis.

13U AAA

An Association may choose to enter a team, consisting of players who reside within their boundaries. A District may choose to enter a team, consisting of any combination of players from within their District's associations.

13U AA

An association may choose to enter a team, consisting of players who reside within their boundaries. Two associations may apply to Baseball BC to merge and field a team consisting of any combination of players from within their association's boundaries. These applications must be received with their entry form by June 15th. Baseball BC will consider such applications on a case by case basis.

A District may choose to enter a team consisting of any combination of players from within their association's team, if the District has entered a team at the AAA level.

All Divisions

An Association may choose to enter a team, consisting of players who reside within their boundaries.

A District may apply to Baseball BC to field a team, consisting of any combination of players from within their District's boundaries. These applications must be received with their registration form by June 15th. Baseball BC will consider such applications on a case by case basis.

In order to be eligible, athletes must be registered/chartered in a Babe Ruth program by May 15th and play a minimum of six games during the spring season.

Babe Ruth age eligibility is based on the actual age of the athlete and not the division they participated in during the season.

Athletes who dual register and are on the roster of a team at a higher level (SR or JR PBL & College Prep/18U AAA) are not eligible. Players who are initially on a roster of a team at a higher level but leave that team by May 1st retain their eligibility.

Scheduling Conflicts

Little League & Babe Ruth

A date overlap conflict may exist for the Little League or Babe Ruth teams who qualify for their own National Championships. In the event this occurs, Baseball BC will allow the team to withdrawal from the Baseball BC Provincial Championship, without financial penalty, in order to attend their National Championship. The team's entry fee and bond will be returned.

Team Commitment Policy

Teams entering Baseball BC Provincial Championships are required to put forth a \$2 000 performance bond as a guarantee on their team's commitment.

Teams may forfeit their performance bond for one of three reasons:

- 1) Failing to play all games in a Provincial Championship or Qualifier.
- 2) Withdrawing from a Provincial Championship or Qualifier less than one month prior to the start of the event.
- 3) Failing to attend any post-Provincial tournament (Western or National) that they have qualified for with a minimum of 50% of their athletes rostered for Provincials. Additionally, should a team that qualifies for a Western or National Championship, choose or be unable to attend, their entire coaching staff may face additional sanctions regarding their future eligibility to participate in all Baseball BC programming and their program/association may face sanctions related to their eligibility to participate in future Baseball BC Provincial Championships. Teams must ensure player commitment for Westerns and Nationals prior to entering. Teams only interested in attending Nationals (with the exception of 18U AAA Tier 1) should not any Championship where Western berths are at stake.

The following violations will result in a specific penalty against the team's performance bond:

- a) Failure to participate in the pre-tournament conference call. \$100 penalty.
- b) Failure to submit a team's roster by the deadline. \$100 penalty per day.

Teams that have not submitted their roster 48 hours prior to a Provincial are subject to removal.

An association who has a team forfeit a performance bond may be subject to increased performance bonds in future seasons.

Westerns & Nationals Pick-up Procedure

Teams that qualify for Western and National Championships are permitted to add pick-ups to their roster.

The decision to add pick-ups is a team choice. Baseball BC will not mandate that teams add to their roster except that the minimum is roster 15 players.

Pick-ups may come from any member or non-member program who may or may not have participated in a Baseball BC Provincial Championship.

Pick-ups for National Championships and AAA Westerns may have played at a higher level during the season and essentially 'play down' as a pick-up. For example, the winning 15U AAA team may add a Junior Premier player as a pick-up, as long as the player is age eligible. Similarly, the winning 13U AAA team may add a player who played at the 15U level, again, as long as they player is age eligible.

Teams may not "cut" players from their Provincial roster for the purpose of creating additional pick-up opportunities for Westerns or Nationals.

Pick-ups for AA Westerns cannot have played at a higher level during the season.

Players may only attend one Western or National tournament as a <u>pick-up</u>. The purpose of this policy is to provide post-provincial opportunities to as many athletes as possible. A player who is on the roster of a team that has qualified for a Western Canada Championship may play in Nationals as a pick-up.

Players may decline an invitation to play as a pick-up at Nationals and remain eligible to be selected as a pick-up for Westerns. The purpose of this policy is to recognize that there may a difference in player availability as the events may fall on different weekends. Players who decline an invitation to attend Westerns with one team are ineligible to be selected as a pick-up by another team attending that same Championship.

NCCP Requirements

Over the past seasons Baseball BC has not had any formal NCCP requirements at Provincials Championships and as a result numerous teams have been unprepared to travel to Western and National Championships as coaches lacked the required certification. Therefore, to ensure that teams are prepared for post-provincial play and to help ensure athletes receive a higher level of coaching, Baseball BC is implementing a hybrid model of coaching certification requirements for our Provincial Championships in 2020.

The following will be Baseball BC's Provincial Championship NCCP requirements for the 2020 season.

Please note that in order to participate in a Western or National tournament one coach must have the level of certification highlighted in yellow while all coaches will require the level of certification highlighted in green. The online module will only suffice for our Provincial.

Member leagues are strongly encouraged to check the qualifications of their coaches at the beginning of single season and summer leagues and proactively encourage coaches to complete their certification at an early date. Often NCCP courses are not available in July.

Coaches must submit their NCCP number on their team's roster. Baseball BC will check certification. Any team found to be in non-compliance will forfeit \$500 from their performance bond. Additionally, the team will need to add a certified coach to their roster, who must be present for all games, in order for the team to participate in the Provincial. Teams who add a certified coach to their roster who has not been coaching the team, for the purpose of becoming compliant with this rule, will be fined \$500 but will be eligible to participate in the Provincial.

Any coach who has not completed the online initiation module will be deleted from their team's roster and not permitted on the field.
