In the process, the students learn much that enriches their education and builds memories that will last a long time. 
Our music program continues to excel as well. Earlier this semester, our Jazz Band won awards at the CMEA (California Music Education Association) festival. Our Jazz Band and smaller Jazz Quartet won unanimous superiors. This means they earned the highest rating from all the judges at the contest. Congratulations to the Jazz Band and Director David Kimura. In March, a number of our instrumental and vocal student musicians participated in *In Concert*, our district Honor Band and Choir performance.

Our student athletes had an incredible winter season in wrestling, basketball, and soccer. Under Coach Bruckner, our Wrestling team won league for the first time in many years, and a number of students qualified to wrestle in CCS competition. Our Boys Basketball team, under Coach Dowd, won league for the sixth season in a row. They made it to the second round of CCS playoffs. Our Girls Soccer team, under Coach DeRosa, had an unbelievable season. After they won the CCS Championship game, our Athletic Director, John Philipopoulos, wrote to our staff: "Congratulations to Girls Varsity Soccer for their victory over Presentation H.S. (2-0) and capturing the school's first ever section championship in girls soccer. They finished the season with a remarkable 23-0-2 record. Even more impressive was the way they carried themselves and represented Burlingame High School with class, dignity, and great sportsmanship throughout the season. Great job... GO PANTHERS!". The Girls Soccer team allowed only 8 goals in 25

games, had 18 shutouts and never lost a game. They finished the season ranked number one in all of CCS. Most importantly to all of us at BHS, they represented our school well.

Our students also continue to excel in the classroom. Before Spring Break, the BHS Administration recognized students for Rising Star (academic improvement) and Honor Roll (3.3 GPA or higher) for first semester. We were able to award a number of students the Rising Star award and over 550 students qualified for the Honor Roll.

The culmination of hard work by our seniors is happening now as they hear from colleges and universities regarding admission. Hearing from colleges for our seniors is a time of joy, disappointment and everything in between. Unfortunately for them, competition to get to many colleges has never been stronger. We know they will do well in the future and make our school proud.

Paul is the proud father of four sons all of whom have Stanford degrees. Paul added this PS: "Lorton Ave. in Burlingame is named after my uncle Fred. He had the money; my father had the children. Guess who they named the street after".


Centennial Gala Dinner/Dance and Fireworks -- Friday, June 6, 2008 -- 6 PM to 1 AM
