

2025 PGYA Basketball Rules Addendum

- **Overtime/Extra Period**
 - **Regular Season Play**
 - If the score is tied at the end of the fourth quarter, play shall continue without change of baskets for ONE extra period with a one-minute intermission before the extra period.
 - The length of the extra period shall be three minutes (or half of a regulation quarter).
 - Overtime is an extension of the fourth quarter. Fouls and time outs will carry over.
 - Coaches may select any 5 players from their roster to play in overtime.
 - The game ends if, at the end of the extra period, the score is no longer tied.
 - If scores are still tied at the end of the extra period, team free throws will begin.
 - Each player on the roster will shoot one free throw. If one team has fewer players than the other, the players with the LOWEST points scored for the entire game (regulation and overtime) will be eligible for one additional free throw. (For example, Team A has 9 player and Team B has 8 players. Each player on Team A will shoot one free throw. Each player on Team B will shoot one free throw. Once each player has taken their shot, one additional player on team B will shoot again. The player taking the extra shot must have scored the fewest points for the entire game).
 - If the score remains tied after one overtime period and free throws have all been completed, the game will end in a tie. (This is for regular season play only. See rules below regarding tournament play).
 - **Tournament Play**
 - If the score is tied at the end of the fourth quarter, play shall continue without change of baskets for one or more extra period with a one-minute intermission before each extra period.
 - The length of extra periods shall be three minutes (or half of a regulation quarter). As many such periods as are necessary to break the tie shall be played.
 - The first overtime is an extension of the fourth quarter. Fouls and time outs will carry over. For any additional extra periods following the first, each team will get an additional time out. Fouls will not reset. They will carry over from the fourth quarter.
 - Coaches may select any 5 players from their roster to play in overtime.
 - The game ends if, at the end of any extra period, the score is no longer tied.
