

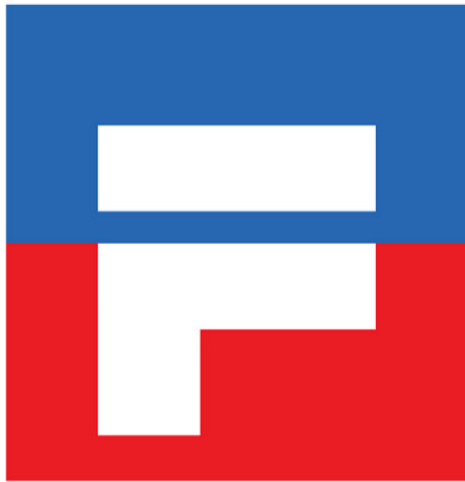

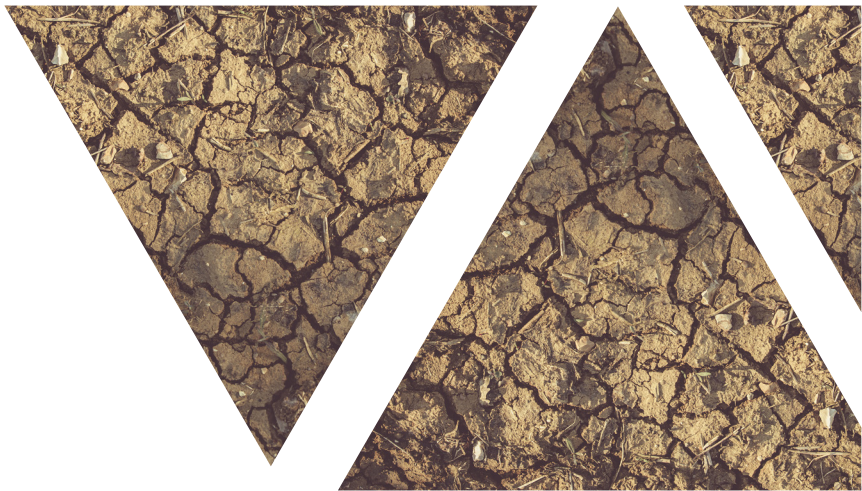

On the high school front, the Renegades (Prep Division), Leo (3A), Vipers (2A), and Homestead (1A) all won State in their respective divisions! Carroll (4A) had an unbelievable season as well, going 17-0 in the regular season and winning both the Roy Chin Cup and Memorial Cup.

On the travel front, 4 of our 6 Blue Teams won their LCAHL divisions in Howe 1 or higher, our 2014 Green Team won the LCAHL Championship in the Smythe Division, and both our 2014 and 2009 Blue Teams won State. Moreover, our 2011 Blue Team finished with an undefeated regular season record of 16-0 in the highest division LCAHL has to offer. 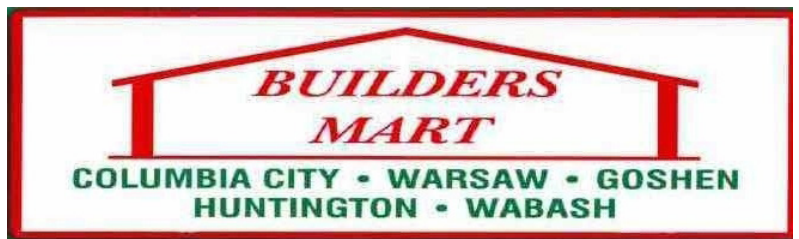
