# School Race Program

Despite the late start to the race season, the race program had near record participation at the Dotty Clark Championships this year. Seventy-two junior high and high schools fielded a team with over 1,600 students involved this year. Five hundred ninety-two junior high racers and 696 high school racers qualified for the Dotty Clark on February 16 and 17.

The program provides an opportunity for all levels of ability and interest. This year, three Saturday races were held in Bitterroot Basin beginning January 28. Seven slalom courses are set each week for novice, intermediate and expert skiers and snowboarders. A freestyle course is set in the Terrain Park for both skiers and snowboarders. One hundred and twenty-five volunteers set courses, start, time, judge and recorded results each week.

Awards presented at the Dotty Clark included medals, ribbons, skis, snowboards, helmets and goggles totaling over \$7,000.

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## Utah Lawmakers Pass Interconnect Bill



# Aosta, Italy Ski Trip Review

If you have never been on one of Paul Markowitz's international trips, consider starting a designated travel fund today! You are missing out on so much fun and seeing the world one ski trip at a time. You cannot beat the group price covering airline, hotel, and most meals. Then it's up to you to decide how much skiing to do; if at all, as there is so much to go tour and take in.

Our trip landed us in Aosta, the capital city of the region of the Valle d'Aosta. It is a mountainous region located in the very upper left (directionally challenged) north-west corner of Italy. It has a population of 130,000 and is the smallest, least populous, and least densely populated region of Italy. It is a true Roman city built on a grid established as a military camp in 25BC with two roads intersecting at right angles. (That's right! I went on a

castle tour and learned all about it.) There are two gates built in the walls leading into the city allowing them to guard and take advantage of the most important passes between Italy to what is now France and Switzerland. Large sections of the city's medieval walls and several towers are clearly visible and in some places still in use. In the walls near the gate, you can still see chunks of the marble slabs that used to line the walls.

For centuries an unending stream of pilgrims trekked through on their way to Rome, braving impossible snows, exhausting altitudes, and the exorbitant tolls levied by local lords. More recently, Napoleon and his armies swept through the region on their way to victory at Marengo. All of this occurred before two of the great engineering feats of our time, the Mont Blanc Tunnel and the Great St. Bernard tunnel were built making it easier to cross the French-Swiss-Italian boards. Valle d' Aosta is no longer on the itineraries of many foreign travelers which makes it our kind of place.



There is something for everyone in this tiny region, including hundreds of castles that sit in the 13 valleys between the mountainous ribs of the region taking in spectacular views, glamorous ski resorts, hearty food and wine, Baroque village churches, and Europe's largest casino.

Italy's best ski resorts are in the Valle d'Aosta, within the shadows of Mont Blanc and the Matterhorn. We skied Pila which was just minutes from Aosta. Pila is about an hour away from Milan and is Milan's equivalent of our Bogus Basin Ski Resort. And boy do they ascend to the mountain. Pushy little Milanese, and I am being kind. Courmayeur is on the Italian side of Mont Blanc, over the Alps from Chamonix. (I couldn't get the pronunciation until slurring comb-your-hair, but it's more like comb-may-yair) Cervinia is lift linked to Zermatt, based on the Italian side of the Matterhorn. Because of its position, the scenery is outstanding. And did you know that Cervinia is entirely purpose-built as it was founded in the 1930s by Mussolini? I really should consider taking on the role of a tour guide while on the bus to and from ski destinations.



Four group members were dropped off in Rome which is Italy's largest city. They were venturing onto Florence. The remaining twenty of us extended to the city of Milan which is Italy's second largest city. Not to be outdone by Rome though, as Milan has a population of 1.3 million while its urban population boasts it to be the largest in Italy at 4.3 million. It is the fourth largest city in Europe. There is very little left of ancient Rome. It has been heavily invaded including WWII. Just a few basilicas here and there. Milan is an architecturally stunning modern

city and is slated to host the world expo in 2014. Milan is home to the Italian Stock Exchange, headquarters to the largest national banks, and recognized as the fashion and design capital of the world. Nancy, our professional shopper, headed up the shopping tour. Turns out Prada was polite to us, Louis Vuitton - not so much. Was it our ski attire? If there is more to life than skiing, then this was it. Paul arranged for a walking tour that took us to the Santa Maria delle Grazie, decorated with Leonardo da Vinci's "The Last Supper." We stood where the great Leonardo painted. I later went back and toured the entire museum. And there are no words to describe the New-Classico opera house known as La Scala with its tier after tier of gold gilded box galleries and enormous chandeliers. It is still one of the most prestigious opera houses in the world with the ability to seat 3,000 goers. And the Duomo, Milan's giant cathedral and one of the largest Gothic churches in the world. It is drippy Gothic taking 500 years to complete.
