#### **DRSA BY-LAWS – SECTION 4.9 – NOMINATIONS FROM THE FLOOR**

Nominations for Governors will not be accepted from the floor unless a nominee, having been defeated for the position for which they were nominated, may be re-nominated from the floor for a subsequent position.

## **DRSA BY-LAWS – SECTION 4.3 – ELIGIBILITY OF GOVERNORS**

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible to hold office as a Governor, an individual must:

- a) Be eighteen (18) years of age or older.
- b) Be a resident of Durham.
- c) Not be employed by the Corporation in a professional capacity.
- d) Not be an employee or board member of an affiliated Member, League, Club or District.
- e) Not have been found under the Substitute Decisions Act, 1992 or under the Mental Health Act to be incapable of managing property.
- f) Have the power under law to contract.
- g) Have not been declared incapable by a court in Canada or in another country; and
- h) Not have the status of bankrupt.
