Player Attendance Policy

- Players are required to attend ALL games and practices.
- There **will be** tournaments ***Thanksgiving Weekend***.
- Acceptable absences include religion, illness, and family emergencies. The need to finish school work is not acceptable; players must balance their schedules and learn how to become student-athletes. It will be required if they wish to play high school hockey and beyond.
- MEA weekend (Oct 17-21) & Christmas (Dec 23-26) will be OPTIONAL practices only for all PLSHA teams for this season. Other holidays and vacations will not be excused from your obligation to your team.
- The following are the consequences of missing a practice or game; the same policy will be standard on ALL teams.
 - Players missing practice due to an unexcused absence will be required to sit one (1) period in the next game.
 - Players missing a game due to an unexcused absence will be required to sit the entire next game.

Parent Conduct Policy

Following USA Hockey “Zero Tolerance” policy applies to both tryouts and in season

INFRACTIONS:

For the **first infraction** during tryouts or current season, the parent shall be removed from all PLSHA events, home or away, for a period of **30 days**

For the **second infraction** during tryouts or current season, the parent shall be removed from all PLSHA events, home or away, for a period of **90 days**

The **parent may appeal** the above stated suspensions after 7 days with a written appeal to the PLSHA Board Officers (President, VP, Treasurer, and Secretary); however, exceptions to the consequences will be rare in accordance with the zero tolerance nature of this policy.

The PLSHA Board of Directors and/or D6 **reserves the right to institute greater penalties** than outlined above as they deem appropriate.

Any parental/guardian/spectator misconduct not specifically alluded to above, will be dealt with on an individual basis by the PLSHA Disciplinary & Grievance Committee.

Bench coaches are exempt from this policy as they are governed by specific District 6 rules for coaches.

Proper Protocol...

BEFORE YOU TAKE ACTION

- wait 24 hrs
- be honest and objective when reflecting on the issue

Learn to Compete: Ages 15-18 female Ages 16-18 male

The objective of the Learn to Compete stage is to prepare athletes for the competitive environment, continue to refine technical skills, ancillary skills and develop the physical.

Train to Train: Ages 11-15 female Ages 12-16 male

The objective of the Train to Train stage is to further develop sports specific skills, begin to introduce competition, and start to emphasize support training to continue development of speed, strength and stamina while maintaining flexibility

Learn to Train: Ages 8-11 females Ages 9-12 males

The objective of the Learn to Train stage is to refine overall sport skills and develop sports specific skills attributes.



Goalie Development

The Mission at **DEVENIR**Goaltenders is to make each of our goalies mentally sharp, more confident and efficient, physically stronger, and enhance the passion to play one of the most demanding positions in sports.

- 5 group sessions and team hours
- \$300 reimbursement program for personal training
- Coach focus – each team to assign a coach to the goalies
- Goalie numbers on the rise!



Dryland

- 1.5 hr sessions
- Player attendance mandatory
- Continue with professional instruction
 - Focus on core, agility, and basic coordination
- Exceed focus will be on hockey specific strength and skills
 - Age specific lesson plans to focus on the appropriate development for athletes (lesson plans can be found on the PLSHA website)
 - Helmets required – NO EXCEPTIONS



Skills Trainer – Butch Kaebel

Butch Kaebel will be joining us this season as our skills trainer.

- Head Coach CHL & ECHL Teams

- Butch is currently an instructor with ProEdge Power

Skills sessions

- Tuesday & Wednesday evenings until mid-Dec
- Teams will see Butch every 3 weeks
- Coaches will be required to attend to improve their teaching techniques





Provides video review and performance analysis tools for sports teams and athletes at every level.

- Hudl offers the tools to edit and share video, interact with stats, and create quality highlight reels for entertainment and recruiting purposes. The whole experience is available online, giving coaches and athletes secure access at home and on the go.

MN Hockey Changes for 2018-19

Concussion Safety

- Each coach will be required to complete concussion training once every two years
- Minnesota Hockey Concussion Reporting and Return to Play form will now need to be completed by a third-party health care professional. No coach, team doctor, team trainer, parent, guardian or relative can execute the Return to Play Form as a health care provider

Squirt/10U Rules

- Squirt/10U teams will be limited to a maximum of 35 games (league, invitational tournament and exhibition), excluding district playoffs

Coach Helmet Rule

- Mandatory 30-day suspension for any coach not wearing a helmet during an on-ice activity. Minnesota Hockey has long had a policy of “up to 30 day suspension” so the primary change is the penalty will now be automatic

SafeSport Requirements

- The SafeSport Training and Refresher Training are each valid for two (2) seasons. Thus, if you took the training during the 2017-18 season, it is valid for the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons.
- As of **January 1, 2018**, all relevant individuals who need to be SafeSport certified or are seeking recertification will need to complete the new **three-course** SafeSport training, which features updated content.

Tryout check-in

- Volunteer Deposit Check OR Buyout
 - **\$300 per player** made out to **PLSHA** and **post-dated to 04/01/2019**
 - Please note “Volunteer Deposit” and player level in memo line
 - **\$250 per player** to BUY OUT of your volunteer obligation, made out to **PLSHA** and **dated current**
 - Please note “Volunteer Buyout” and player level in memo line
- For new players to PLSHA:
 - non-returnable copy of child’s birth certificate (if not e-mailed to Registrar or uploaded at registration)

Parents: Please make sure your child has everything for check-in! Otherwise, **they cannot get on the ice until turned in.**

REMINDER! Consent to Treat & Code of Conduct will not be collected at tryouts. Once teams are formed, Team Managers will collect your consent to treat. The code of conduct is signed at registration.

HDC / Board Tryout Principles

- **Be thorough:** Have multiple sessions and evaluators; Use previous coach input where needed
- **Be consistent:** Board Liaisons utilized to monitor integrity of process
- **Be as transparent as possible:** Evaluation criteria posted
- **No Distractions:** Tryouts are closed to parents – Please respect this!
- **Feedback and modifications:**
 - Skill Drills vs. Scrimmages
 - Skills are what is evaluated, from the time the athlete hits the ice until they step off. The scrimmage format is the best way to evaluate skills. Goals and winning does not matter.
 - Squirt positions and fairness of shifts
 - Squirt Liaison and additional volunteer positions on the bench to ensure more fairness and equal distribution of positions
 - No outside or AAA jerseys will be allowed. Laker wear only

2018-19 Tryouts

- Level Designations; Sept 25th deadline
- HS Refs, face-offs, and timed shifts (change on horn)
- Maintain role of non-parent evaluators; we have 6-7 per level
- Allow a family to skip tryouts if desire “C” team placement
- Avoid fall sports/homecoming conflicts as much as possible; will never be perfect
- All players **MUST** wear a gold or navy helmets + jerseys + socks!
PLSHA will provide as needed

- Our tryout staff has experience as coaches, players, evaluators at one or more of the following levels; D1, D3, Junior, High School, and Youth. They also have significant experience as evaluators and coaches

Consistency matters!

*The best players will be selected for each respective team regardless of position previously played. The evaluators will identify appropriate strengths and weaknesses regardless of position.

*Last year's team is used as supplemental information as needed when determining bubble picks (all things being equal)...

DAY 1 and 2

- Every evaluator scores every player 1-5 (5 is best)
- Scores are entered in PC
- Establishes player ranking
- Posted each night

DAY 3 and 4

- Pools are created
- Looking for outliers
- Players ranked 1's or 2's
- Scores entered into PC
- Bubble players discussed at depth in war room



Volunteer Policy

- **Volunteer Deposit**
 - \$300 per player
- **Buyout Option** - For those families choosing not to volunteer PLSHA/D6 hours
 - \$250 per player
- **Hours**
 - Team hours are expected and will be rotated by the team manager in order to successfully operate the team
 - PLSHA/D6 (DIBS) hours will be designated year-to-year by the Board based on needs and PLSHA Commitments
 - 2017-18 there will be a minimum of 8 PLSHA/D6 hours required per player
 - You do receive 1 hour for your attendance this evening
- **Exemptions**
 - Please check the policy. Don't assume .
- **Compliance**
 - The deposit check(s) **WILL BE CASHED** if the volunteer requirements are not fulfilled by the end of the current hockey season, or there are balances due. Final determination will be made by the board.

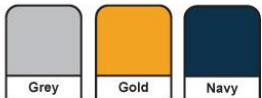
