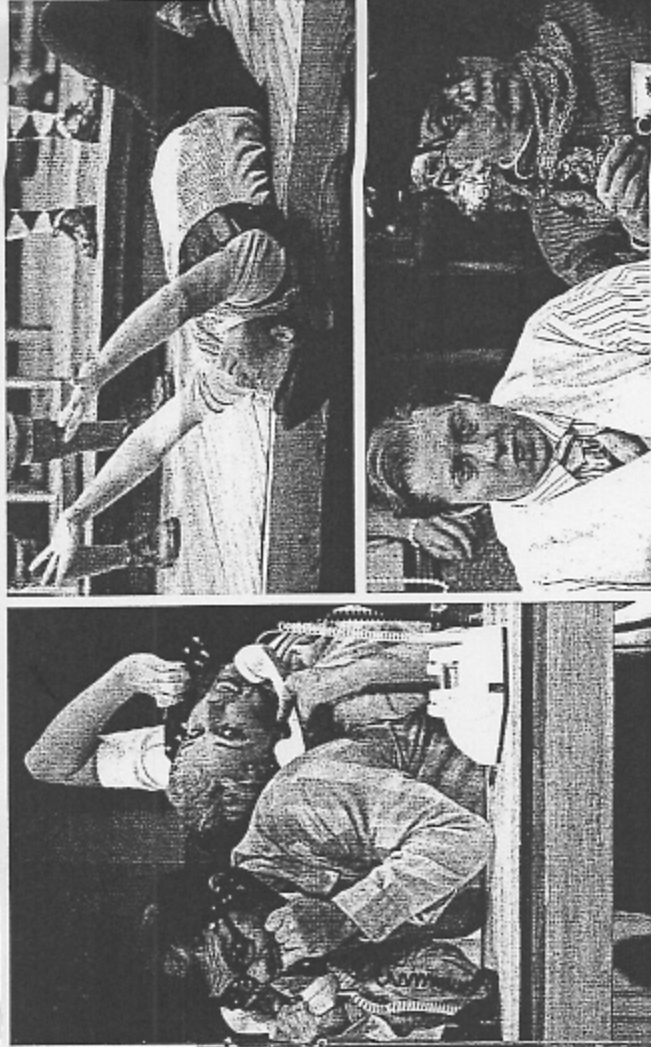

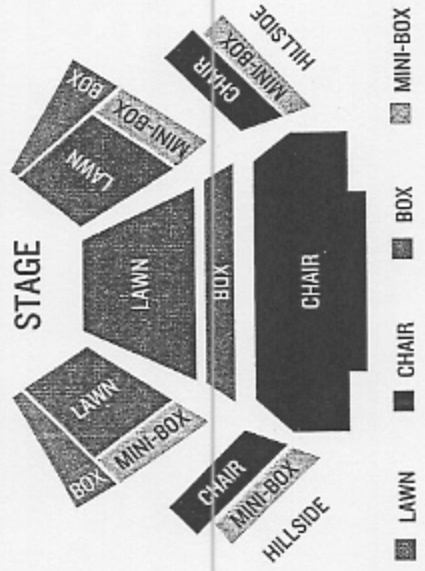

Proceed 5.7 miles and you'll see the theater on the right, behind the Idaho Department of Parks & Recreation building. OR, coming from the west, take Highway 21 exit off I-84. Proceed north across the bridge, immediately turn left onto Warm Springs Avenue and drive about two miles to the Amphitheater.
