b. **Volleyball-**

1. Lots of stress with being down referees for 7th & 8th grade.

c. **Basketball -**

1. Mike started off by saying that he was very disappointed in all the school reps because he did not have every school forms turned into him before the meeting. Forms were due at the meeting on Nov 5, 2025 .
2. League Rules to be voted on at tonight's meeting. The part in red is the part that was discussed and voted on.

a. **Development League 2nd-3rd Grade:**

1. **One coach can be positioned under the goal on the defensive end.**

No coach will be on the floor with the players. One referee will be provided by the league. While the ball is in play, coaches must remain in their seats, except for spontaneous reaction to an outstanding play. Only three (3) coaches may be on the bench with the players and only the head coach can assist a referee with helping the players understand why a foul has been called. The referee may ask the head coach to assist on the court for teaching purposes, depending on game-time situations. **(Updated Rule after the vote: No coach will be on the floor with the players. One referee will be provided by the league. While the ball is in play, coaches must remain in their seats, except for spontaneous reaction to an outstanding play. Only three (3) coaches may be on the bench with the players and only the head coach can assist a referee with helping the players understand why a foul has been called. The referee may ask the head coach to assist on the court for teaching purposes, depending on game-time situations.)**

2. All Remaining Development League rules were voted to stay the

same.

b. 4th-8th Grade League:

1. **PRESS RULE:** Leagues A, B, C, D, and E may press at any time unless the defensive team has a 20-point lead in leagues A, B, and C, or a 10-point lead in leagues D and E. **Leagues D and E may only press in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter.** Once the aforementioned lead is achieved the defensive team may not apply a press. In leagues A, B, and C, a press cannot be applied in the backcourt. In leagues D and E, a press cannot be applied past the 3-point line on the defensive end. This includes balls being inbounded in the back court, off steals and rebounds. This is only after a clear change of possession. **(Updated Rule after the vote: PRESS RULE: Leagues A, B, and C may press at any time unless the defensive team has a 20-point lead. Leagues D and E may press only in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter, and only if the defensive team has less than a 10-point lead. Once the aforementioned lead is achieved the defensive team may not apply a press. In leagues A, B, and C, a press cannot be applied in the backcourt. In leagues D and E, a press cannot be applied past the 3-point line on the defensive end. This includes balls being inbounded in the back court, off steals and rebounds. This is only after a clear change of possession.)**
2. **Rule #15. Per the National Federation of High School rules, no jewelry of any kind is allowed, except for ear posts and permanent jewelry as explained below, and except for religious jewelry as explained below. This includes bracelets, necklaces, chains, watches, rings, ear rings, etc. The list is not intended to be exhaustive. Posts installed due to a recent piercing of the ears, and permanent jewelry, may be worn if they are completely covered by medical tape. Religious jewelry and medical alert necklaces are allowed, but must be worn inside the uniform, and must be taped to the body. (Updated Rule after the vote: Per the National Federation of High School rules, no jewelry of any kind is allowed, except for religious jewelry as explained below. This includes bracelets, necklaces, chains, watches, rings, ear rings, etc. It also includes any posts installed due to a recent piercing of the ears, as well as any item known as permanent jewelry. Wearing tape over jewelry is not permitted. The list is not intended to be exhaustive. Religious jewelry and medical alert necklaces are allowed, but must be worn inside the uniform, and must be taped to the body.)**
3. **Rule #18-**If a player (both boys and girls) wears an undershirt under his or her jersey, the undershirt must be the same color as the jersey body. The team designated as the visiting team may also wear black undershirts, but all teammates wearing undershirts must wear the same solid color. It cannot be the trim color or plain white, unless the team wears white jerseys. (Note: if your team has reversible jerseys, you must carry undershirts that match when you flip to the other side) If a player wears a leg girdle, it must be the same color as **the pants, both legs must be covered, and the length of the two legs must be equal.** Also, the sleeves of the undershirt must be the same length. It is the coach's responsibility to make certain his/her team complies with this rule. **For each player that violates this rule a technical foul shall be assessed against the player, which will count towards the individual's fouls and the team fouls. Only one technical foul for a uniform violation can be assessed against any one player in any one game. The non-conforming uniform can still be worn.**

(Updated Rule after the vote: If a player (both boys and girls) wears an undershirt under his or her jersey, the undershirt must be the same color as the jersey body. The team designated as the visiting team may also wear black undershirts, but all teammates wearing undershirts must wear the same solid color. It cannot be the trim color or plain white, unless the team wears white jerseys. (Note: if your team has reversible jerseys, you must carry undershirts that match when you flip to the other side) If a player wears a leg girdle, it must be the same color as the shorts. The sleeves of the undershirt can be different lengths, and the length of the leg girdles can be different lengths. It is the coach's responsibility to make certain his/her team complies with this rule.)

4. Forfeits will be \$100.00 per game. **The forfeit fee will be distributed as follows: (1) an amount to the declared winner that equals the pro-rata league fee for one game (2) \$20.00 to the host gym as reimbursement for lost concession sales, and (3) the balance retained by the league. 2 forfeits in a season will cause that team and its players and coaches to be ineligible for the city and state tournament. Any exceptions must be presented to the Executive Committee for approval.** (Updated Rule after the vote: Forfeits will be \$100.00 per game. The forfeit fee will be distributed as follows: (1) an amount to the declared winner that equals the pro-rata league fee for one game (2) \$20.00 to the host gym as reimbursement for lost concession sales, and (3) the balance retained by the league. 2 forfeits in a season will cause that team and its players and coaches to be ineligible for the city and state tournament. Any exceptions must be presented to the Executive Committee for approval.)
5. All remaining rules were voted to stay the same.

3. Development League fee is \$325 per team.

4. CGSAA League fee is \$625 per team.

5. Tulsa Tournament is December 5th-7th
