While we are eager to get our kids back on the field, we are committed to player safety during both practices and games. LSA will follow all applicable guidelines by the State of Ohio along with any additional local regulations. Our specific Covid-19 guidelines as they relate to Saturday Soccer are as follows:

Health Assessments – Players, coaches, spectators and officials must conduct daily symptom checks prior to any camps, practices, or games. This self assessment must be done prior to each event. Anyone experiencing symptoms must not attend the event.

Social Distancing – Players and spectators are expected to maintain a safe distance before, during and after activities. Parents are encouraged to drop players off at practices. For those choosing to stay it is expected that they maintain a safe distance from other spectators and players. Six feet social distance must be maintained when not on the field of play. Please refrain from congregating in groups before and after practices or games.

Spectator Limits – Preventing large gatherings is an important step in keeping our players, families, and volunteers safe. With more than 500 registered players, we appreciate your help in bringing only immediate family/guardians to watch the games.

Face Coverings – Face masks are required. Coaches and spectators must wear a mask at all times. Players must wear a mask to and from the fields. They may remove face coverings during competition but must replace when not in the game.

Equipment – Players must bring their own water bottle and soccer ball. They must not share drinks or equipment.

Hand Sanitizer / Hand Washing – Please wash hands often. If hand washing is not an option please use hand sanitizer. Hand sanitizer will be made available whenever possible.

Concessions – Concessions will be limited to water and gatorade.

Suspected / Confirmed Cases – Please let us know if your child has been exposed to Covid-19 or tests positive once our season has started. We will work with the local health department to identify individuals who were potentially exposed to help facilitate contact tracing. Any affected individual must follow the procedures set forth by the Ohio Department of Health for returning to competition.
