2021-2022 COVID-19 Mitigation Plan

Updated: October 25, 2021 – NOTE: This document is subject to periodic updating as new guidance from the St. Louis Park School District, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the Minnesota Department of Health becomes available.

The St. Louis Park Traveling Basketball program is committed to providing safe and healthy spaces for our coaches, volunteers and participants. We have and will continue to follow COVID-19 guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), and St. Louis Park Public Schools.

GENERAL:

- If a player, coach or volunteer is exhibiting ANY symptoms of COVID-19 (as defined by the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#)), he or she should stay home from any basketball activity.
- Per instructions from the St. Louis Park School District, masks are to be worn by **everyone** who enters a St. Louis Park school or practice facility. Players will be allowed to remove their masks (should they so choose) after gearing up and prior to stepping on the floor.
- Players may choose to wear a face mask while practicing or competing if they are so inclined.
- Players should bring their own water bottles.

ABOUT COVID-19 EXPOSURES:

- Practices and games are considered close contact.
- Close contact extends 48 hours prior to the onset of symptoms or a positive COVID test.
- As outlined by the [St. Louis Park Public Schools COVID Return to School Guide](#), youth who have been in close contact with a positive COVID-19 case **DO NOT NEED TO QUARANTINE...**
 - if the person exposed has been vaccinated, AND
 - does not have COVID-19 symptoms, OR
 - has recovered from COVID-19 in the past 90 days, OR
 - was wearing a mask at the time of the exposure.
 - Note: verification of vaccination or previous exposure may be requested.
- As outlined by the [St. Louis Park Public Schools COVID Return to School Guide](#), youth who have been in close contact with a positive COVID-19 case **DO NEED TO QUARANTINE...**
 - if the person exposed exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, OR
 - has NOT been vaccinated, OR
 - was NOT wearing a mask at the time of the exposure.
- In general, as outlined by [St. Louis Park Public Schools](#), when quarantine is warranted, 10 days are required (without testing) or 7 days with a negative test result. The test must occur on day 5 or later after exposure.
