

P.R.Y.S.A. Risk Management Policies

Every volunteer or employee, who at any time could be expected in the performance of their duties to be alone with any registered youth player, must have on file with their home club, a criminal record check not older than 36 months.

BC Soccer has changed its requirements for volunteers, instead of completing Form A & B, All volunteers are required to obtain and submit a criminal record check not older than 36 months.

BC Soccer - Risk Management - Rule 22 (Amended June 11, 2011)

- Every volunteer or employee of the Association or affiliated organization who at any time could be expected in the performance of their duties to:
 - be with any minor aged person;
 - be entrusted with performing financial duties;
 - be responsible for book keeping or bank account(s);

The youth soccer organisation must have on file the results of a Criminal Record Check completed within the previous 36 months from an agency approved by the Association.

Rationale

To eliminate the Form A and B process and allow for the use of myBackcheck or some other such approved process. NOTE: this amendment may be withdrawn if there is no resolution to the privacy issues with myBackCheck.

The approved agencies for Criminal Record Checks are:

- RCMP
- Municipal Police Departments
- myBackCheck.com
