



For the second year in a row, Christ Prep Academy, of Lenexa, Kansas. has won the National Homeschool Football
Association Championship. Going in to this year's tournament with a No. 1 ranking last Thursday night, Christ Prep (CPA) beat No. 4 Georgia Force 25-3, earning their slot in the championship game on Saturday night. In Saturday's last game of the 16-game tournament, CPA fought a tough battle down to the closing 2 minutes against a hard-hitting NOAH squad from Tulsa, Oklahoma. Final score was 21-13 in favor of the reigning champs.

The CPA Patriots have now posted a 22-3 record over the past two years and are 5-1 in their last 6 tournament games. CPA entered this year's tournament averaging 41ppg offensively against 6ppg defensively, with 7 shutouts. Even though per game averages dipped a little from their two championship round games (38ppg offensively-6ppg defensively), their defensive strength proved to be the team signature as they hung tough and made plays that mattered the most when needed. As proven on the field, time and time again, this defensive unit would bend but not break.

The two teams scrapped back and forth all night, moving the ball up and down the field using an exciting array of plays including, a blocked punt, interceptions, multiple wildcats, hook-and-ladder and swinging gate formations.

The game turned when NOAH had just stopped CPA on a 4th and 15 at midfield in a three-and out series.

CPA's Nick Classen kicked the punt down inside the 20, but it rolled into the end zone before his teammates could down the ball. NOAH took over at their own 20yard line, and with 2:45 left on the clock had plenty of time to tie the game. QB Mikey Barnett put the Patriot players and fans on edge by threading the CPA secondary with his passes. He moved NOAH up to midfield with successive pass completions. On their own 47, the Patriot defense broke up a first down pass. Barnett then completed his next throw, but the Patriot defense refused to give up any yards. NOAH then went to their bread-and-butter delivery man, Christian Sabatini, who had been giving Patriot defenders fits all night long. Patriots CB Noah Blair stepped into the breach, as he so often does, sniffing out the play and intercepting the ball at the 1:31 mark - effectively ending NOAH's chances to tie the game.

There were many Patriot players who stood out in this game. Junior DE Paul Lindstrom came up with a key punt blocked at the NOAH 15-yard line, which led to a quick Patriot score – and the difference in this game. Junior TE Ben Einess ran the wildcat well, frustrating NOAH defenders and scoring 2 touchdowns. Senior QB/CB Noah Blair was once again named tournament MVP for his impact on the games and leadership on both sides of the ball.

Christ Prep is now the only team in the history of this national tournament to win back-to-back championships, and Noah Blair is the only player in history, to win back-to-back MVP awards.

Christ Prep football began in 2003 when Dick Burton, a homeschool Dad, desired to see character taught and modeled to his own sons and saw football as a tool that could be used to do just that. 15+ years later, and through the succeeding 3 head coaches after Coach Burton (Dave Wallace, Jim Cook & Tom Hurley), the same passion and desire is at the heart of this program and runs through the entire coaching staff, administrative staff & numerous volunteers who devote countless hours to making this program available to young men throughout the Kansas City metro area

Over the years Christ Prep Football has had much success. With winning seasons in 12 of 16 years, a record of 21-3 in the past two years, and over 30 alumni who have gone on to play at the collegiate level, our program is judged by the young men who have come through it, still following Christ, are faithful husbands & fathers, involved in and supporting their local church, providing for their families and benefiting society.

CPA first entered the NHFA National Tournament in 2012 and have been back every year since. Fighting their way into the championship bracket in 2014, 2017, 2018 & 2019, they finished 2nd in 2014, 3rd in 2017, 1st in 2018 and 1st in the 2019 event.

The only loss suffered by Christ Prep in 2019 was to an Olpe, KS team that finished the year 10-1, losing in their state playoffs to Centralia, Kan.



PATRIOT FOOTBALL HISTORY

A Football Journey



In 2003 Dick Burton, a homeschool father of 8 sons, missed coaching and decided to return to start up the football program for this new University Model School called Christ Prep. His first calls were to his assistant coaches, Jay Geeding, Mark Geeding, and Jim Cook. Soon after, most of his former players (mostly homeschoolers) joined and won the National Association of Christian Athletics (NACA) Div I 8-man football tournament. A fantastic start for a program in its inaugural season.

Over the next seven seasons years Burton's Patriots continued to overwhelm the competition. The team grew and at the start of the 2006 season Burton briefly turned over the reins to Defensive Coordinator Jim Sanders and moved the team up to 11-man football. Burton then returned mid-season and finished one of the best seasons in school history with a record of 9-5 and runner-up in the NAFA Tournament. The highlight of the season came with a hard fought victory over an undefeated Hogan Prep team on Oct. 7th. Burton retired after the 2009 season with a winning percentage of 60% and record of 50-33.

During those early years the team practiced at Mid-American Nazarene University and played games in southern Olathe but when Dave Wallace took over as head coach he moved the team to Red Bridge Baptist Church in Grandview, MO. During Wallace's tenure a rivalry with Lighthouse Christian Chargers, the homeschool team in Springfield, MO, was birthed. CPA won three of the first four meetings including a dominating performance in 2010 by Darren Wallace,

Jared Nield and a 4 TD receiving day by Jack Layman to win 41-20. Then in 2011 Lighthouse went on a three game win streak to take a 4-3 advantage.

Wallace retired after two seasons and Jim Cook took over a program that had dwindled to 16 players. Cook began to make structural changes including improving the practice field at Red Bridge, starting up the Redzone Camp, lots of recruiting for both Junior High and High School. He and booster club president, Grea Finley, made the decision to participate in the National Homeschool Football tournament in Panama City, FL. The first trip in 2012, was a huge success from the perspective of coaches, players and families. CPA finished 6th out of 8 teams, but hungry for more.



In 2013, the team made it to the top bracket in Florida and finished 3rd. They set the stage for an amazing 2014 season for both Junior High and High School. The JH Patriots, coached by Tom Hurley, finished the season 8-1-1 redeeming their only defeat to St. Mary's by winning the rematch and a fought to a 6-6 tie versus Lighthouse.

The varsity team dominated their regular season schedule including an impressive win over rival Lighthouse by a score of 30-14 but finished runner-up in Panama City to those same Chargers by score of 21-7. That team closed the season as the highest ranked homeschool team in the country.

In 2016 Josh Burton, Dick Burton's son, assumed command of the junior high program which enabled Coach Hurley to move up to high school. Hurley immediately focused on equipment upgrades and replacing the helmets so that today our players have state of the art protection.

The team continues to focus on building Christian character as well as public speaking skills. Christ Prep embraces the symbiotic relationship between CPA's KSHAA status and academic students along with homeschoolers who participate in athletics in general, but particularly football.

Tom Hurley

Head Coach

Tom Hurley believes that many sports are great for teaching character, but football is unique. "The physical and mental adversity that a player faces in football provide unique teaching opportunities for what these young men will face later in life," Hurley said. "The required daily Bible reading is also unique to our program. Our hope is that it becomes a habit not only during the football season but that it carries over for the rest of their lives."

Hurley started playing football in the ninth grade, and by the end of high school, he claimed an impressive list of accomplishments, including: State of Colorado Class A 8-Man, First Team All-State Offensive Guard, and First **Team All-State Defensive** End. He was the only player in his school's history to be All-State on both offense and defense. He credits his high school coach, Larid Crump, for any success he had as a player and more importantly, who he is as a man today.

Hurley became a coach when his oldest son started playing football. At that time, the family was living in Oklahoma City. He coached his son's junior high homeschool team for three years and the varsity team for one year.

In 2011, the family moved to Kansas City for his work, and he began to search for a football team for his son. "I Googled 'Homeschool Football Kansas City' and found a couple of options," Hurley said. "Through reading the Christ Prep website I knew this was the one." Hurley took over as head coach for the junior high in 2012 after serving in the equipment trailer for one season, and he is entering his fourth year as head coach for varsity.

Hurley and his wife of 30 years, Heidi, have nine children ranging in age from 10 to 28 and now one grandson. He is certain that Heidi has a direct impact on the Christ Prep program.

"My ability to coach is directly tied to her loving support of me and this ministry to these young men." Hurley said. "Her willingness to do everything at home when I am not there is what makes it possible for me to coach; this includes caring for my Mom who lives with us and has MS."

As a coach, he is most proud of the players and coaches that have helped the program to reach the pinnacle of the homeschool football world by winning back-to-back NHFA & NHFCS national championship in 2018 and 2019. "This was years in the making and many players and coaches helped to build the program the right way which enabled us to achieve this milestone" Hurley said. His overarching goal has always been to be the best homeschool football program in the country - both from a spiritual standpoint and in terms of football play."







"So, I want to help others learn about life now and eternal life through fellowship."








When she needed clarity about pursuing a long-term relationship with Parrish, it was a Christ Prep family member who provided confirmation for Liz.




Pete Burton

RB, WR, Returner / 2003-2007


Jon Thomas played for the patriots and graduated in 2007. He was a running back, wide receiver and return specialist.

Elisha Stegner


