## TONIGHT'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team takes on Czechia here tonight in quarterfinal play at the 2024 IIHF Men's World Championship. The two teams met in last year's quarterfinals with Team USA earning a 3-0 victory. All Team USA games air live on NHL Network.

## THE SERIES VS. CZECHIA

The U.S. and Czechia meet for the 20th time in IIHF Men's World Championship history here tonight. Team USA is 7-2-1-8-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) against Czechia all-time. The most recent meeting between the two teams came in the quarterfinals of last year's tournament, which was won by Team USA, 3-0.

## THE LINEUP TONIGHT

Team USA will utilize the same lineup tonight as it did in its game vs. Latvia on Tuesday, meaning defenseman **Matthew Kessel**, forward **Will Smith** and goaltender **Trey Augustine** will not dress.

## QUARTERFINAL HISTORY

The U.S. has advanced to the quarterfinals of the world championship for the 13th straight time. Team USA is 9-2-4-11 (W-OTW-OTL-L) in 26 previous quarterfinal appearances and has won six of its last eight quarterfinal contests. Quarterfinal games have been played in the tournament since 1992 (with the exception of 1997, 1998 and 1999) and the U.S. has qualified all but twice.

## QUICK BITS

The U.S. is the home team, will wear its white "1960" jerseys and occupy the right bench ... **Brock Nelson** has 19 career goals in the men's worlds, tied for the most of any American. His next goal will break a more than 70-year-old mark held by two players. **Bruce Mather** scored 19 goals in the 1949 men's world championship and **Russell "Buzz" Johnson** had 19 goals over two worlds in 1949 and 1950 ... The U.S. had yesterday off. Team USA returned to the ice late this morning for a brief skate and talked with the assembled media following the skate ... Many of Team USA's players and families went to the Old Town for dinner last night.

## STATISTICALLY SPEAKING

Team USA has the top three point-getters in the tournament in **Matt Boldy** (6-8--14), **Brady Tkachuk** (7-6--13) and **Johnny Gaudreau** (3-8--11) .... Boldy and Gaudreau are tied for first in assists with eight and **Shane Pinto** is tied for second with seven ... Tkachuk is second in goals with seven, while Boldy is tied for third with six ... **Zach Werenski** is second in time on ice at 23:20 a game and third in defensemen scoring at 2-5--7 ... Pinto is tied for second in +/- rating at +9, while Boldy and Gaudreau are tied for third at +8 ... Team USA has 328 shots on goal, 47 more than runner-up Sweden ... The U.S. has not yielded a power play goal and is tied with Poland as the least penalized team in the tournament.

## BOLDY

**Matt Boldy** enters play tonight with 14 points, the fourth most ever in a single world championship for a U.S. player. **Patrick Kane** holds the current top spot with 20 points in 2018, while **Richard Roberge** had 16 in 1962 and **Paul Coppo** had 15, also in 1962. **Rocco Grimaldi** recorded 14 points in last year's world championship, the same number **Craig Smith** had in 2013.

## THIS AND THAT

Team USA is playing in its fifth 8:20 p.m. start of the tournament here tonight and is 3-0-1-0 in the first four. In its only 8:20 p.m. loss, which came to Slovakia by a 5-4 count in overtime, the U.S. rallied from a 4-1 deficit after two period to send the game to OT ... The U.S. is looking to advance to the semifinals of the men's worlds for the fourth straight year for the first time ever ... **Ron DeGregorio**, former president of USA Hockey and IIHF Council member, is here in Prague. USA Hockey's National Team Development Program was one of the many signature ideas of DeGregorio during his illustrious 40-plus-year career as one of the top USA Hockey volunteers of all time ... The U.S. will host both the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship and IPC Para Sled Hockey World Championship next season. Final locations are expected to be announced in the near future ... USA Hockey will stage the World Junior Summer Showcase at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Mich., in late July/early August with Finland, Sweden and Canada participating ... **Mike Trimboli**, president of USA Hockey, **Pat Kelleher**, executive director of USA Hockey and **Dwayne Dillinger**, vice president of USA Hockey are all here in Prague for the remainder of the world championship ... **Natalie Darwitz**, who previously starred for the U.S. Women's National Team and is currently the GM of PWHL Minnesota, will be enshrined into the IIHF Hall of Fame here this weekend. In addition, broadcaster **Al Michaels**, who famously remarked "Do You Believe In Miracles .... Yes!" in calling the final seconds of Team USA's historic win over the Soviet Union in the 1980 Olympic Winter Games, will be honored with the inaugural IIHF Media Award here in Prague on Saturday.

## AN INTERESTING GOALTENDING STORY

The U.S. has played four goaltenders in the world championship to date, including **Alex Lyon**, **Trey Augustine**, **Alex Nedeljkovic** and **Charlie Lindgren**. Lyon faced Sweden in Team USA's opener and then suffered a tournament-ending injury in game two against Germany. He was replaced by Trey Augustine. Alex Nedeljkovic arrived after the Germany game and played nearly the first half of the next contest against Slovakia, however, was pulled in favor of Augustine after yielding four goals. Nedeljkovic returned to beat France, while Augustine started and got the victory against Poland. Nedeljkovic then picked up the win vs. Kazakhstan before Lindgren arrived to replace the injured Lyon and earned the victory in Team USA's final preliminary round game against Latvia.

## NTDP IMPACT

A total of 16 players on the U.S. Men's National Team roster have played at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program in Plymouth, Mich. (greater Detroit). Two of the 16 -- **Kevin Hayes** and **Alex Nedeljkovic** -- played just a few games at the NTDP, which is a two-year residency program for the top 16- and 17-year-old men's players in the U.S. A total of 14 others played full-time at the NTDP, including **Luke Hughes**, **Seth Jones**, **Jake Sanderson**, **Alex Vlasic**, **Zach Werenski**, **Matt Boldy**, **Cole Caulfield**, **Joel Farabee**, **Luke Kunin**, **Brady Tkachuk**, **Trevor Zegras**, **Ryan Leonard**, **Trey Augustine** and **Will Smith**.

## GAUDREAU NEW CAREER LEADER IN POINTS, ASSISTS

**Johnny Gaudreau**, became the all-time U.S. career leader in the men's worlds in both points and assists in Team USA's game win over Kazakhstan on May 19. **Brock Nelson** is just one goal shy of becoming the leading all-time American goal scorer in the world championship.

# 2024 U.S. Men's National Team Game Notes

## AUGUSTINE YOUNGEST EVER

U.S. netminder **Trey Augustine** is 19 years-old and the youngest goaltender to ever play for Team USA in the IIHF Men's World Championship. Augustine, born on February 23, 2005, will be 19 years, 3 months and 3 days old on the final day of the tournament. He played in a relief role for the injured Alex Lyon in Team USA's contest vs. Germany on May 11 and stopped 11-of-12 shots, including a breakaway shortly after coming into the game early in the second period. He also played in a relief role in Team USA's 5-4 overtime loss to Slovakia on May 13 and made eight stops on nine shots. Augustine picked up his first win in the men's worlds on Friday (May 17) with 20 saves in a 4-1 victory over Poland. Only five 19-year-old goaltenders have ever played for Team USA in the men's worlds, also including **John Gibson** (2013), **Rick DiPietro** (2001), **Mike Dunham** (1992), and **Mike Richter** (1986). Please note that an earlier edition of these game notes portrayed that Clem Harnedy, in 1934, was the youngest American to ever play goal for the U.S., however, further research indicated he was 20 yrs., 2 months, 18 days old on the last day of the 1934 event.

## THE HUGHES BLOODLINE

U.S. defenseman **Luke Hughes** is a finalist for the NHL's Calder Trophy, along with fellow American Brock Faber and Connor Bedard. Hughes and his brothers Quinn and Jack all played at the USA Hockey National Team Development Program and all three now star in the NHL -- Luke and Jack for the New Jersey Devils and Quinn for the Vancouver Canucks. Quinn is one of three finalists for the NHL's Norris Trophy (and the prohibitive favorite to win the award), along with Roman Josi and Cale Makar. Ellen Hughes, the mother of Quinn, Jack and Luke, is a former member of the U.S. Women's National Hockey Team and today serves as a player development consultant for the squad.

## INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

The U.S. is the only nation in the world that has qualified for the gold-medal game of every major world championship this season to date.

## LEADERSHIP

**Brady Tkachuk** is the captain of Team USA. He serves as the captain of the NHL's Ottawa Senators and was the captain of the gold medal-winning U.S. National Under-18 Team in the 2017 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship. The U.S. has three alternate captains in **Brock Nelson**, **Seth Jones** and **Zach Werenski**. The three have played in a total of eight previous IIHF Men's World Championships.

## NOTES FROM PREVIOUS VERSIONS OF GAME NOTES

**Trevor Zegras** is just the second "Z" ever to compete for the U.S. Men's National Team. The first and previously only was **Ed Zifcak**, who played in the 1958 worlds. Zifcak is one of Phillip and Frances Zifcak's 13 children. Phillip, four years before the outbreak of World War I, emigrated from the Slovakian region of the teetering Austro-Hungarian Empire and two years later Frances followed ... Team USA features two "Beezers." **Joel Farabee** is called Beezer by his teammates, a nickname that started at the beginning of his professional career, while **John Vanbiesbrouck**, part of Team USA's management group, had his nickname of Beezer coined by Terry Crisp, who coached him in junior hockey with the Soo Greyhounds ... **Jim Hughes**, father of Luke Hughes, arrived late on May 12 and is here for remainder of the tournament ... Team USA's roster includes four players who helped the U.S. win gold at the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship this past December/January in Gothenburg, Sweden. The group includes goaltender **Trey Augustine** and forwards **Gavin Brindley**, **Ryan Leonard** and **Will Smith** ... The U.S. will host both the IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship and IPC Para Sled Hockey World Championship in 2024-25. The dates and locations will likely be announced this summer. USA Hockey recently announced that St. Paul and Minneapolis, Minnesota, will be the host cities for the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championship, the 50th edition of the tournament that was initially conceived by former U.S. Olympic coach Murray Williamson, who currently lives in the greater St. Paul/Minneapolis area ... **Bijan Sabet**, the U.S. Ambassador to Czechia, attended the U.S.-Sweden preliminary round game on May 10 in Ostrava ... **John Hynes** is the head coach of Team USA in the world championship for the second time after guiding the U.S. in the 2016 world championship in St. Petersburg and Moscow, Russia (4-1-1-4/4th). Hynes also served as an assistant coach for Team USA in the 2019 men's worlds in Bratislava and Kosice, Slovakia (4-1-0-3/7th) ... **Brock Nelson** has played in 78 NHL playoffs games (27-23--50), the most of anyone on Team USA. **Kevin Hayes** is next at 56 games played (8-18--26) ... Ten players have competed previously for Team USA in the IIHF Men's World Championship, including **Alex Lyon** (2015), **Seth Jones** (2014, 2015, 2022), **Jeff Petry** (2012, 2013, 2014), **Zach Werenski** (2019), **Matt Boldy** (2022), **Mikey Eyssimont** (2023), **Johnny Gaudreau** (2014, 2017, 2018, 2019), **Kevin Hayes** (2014, 2017), **Luke Kunin** (2019) and **Brock Nelson** (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017). Additionally, **Alex Nedeljkovic** was part of Team USA for the 2022 men's world championship, but got hurt in pre-camp and returned to the U.S. ... **Derek Lalonde** is leading the U.S. power play, while **Jack Capuano** is in charge of the U.S. penalty kill.

## THE JOURNEY TO GET TO OSTRAVA

A total of 22 players, along with Team USA's staff, gathered at Newark International Airport on Saturday, May 4, and flew to Bratislava, Slovakia, where the U.S. conducted a short pre-camp and played its lone pre-tournament game on Tuesday (May 7) against Slovakia. Team USA earned a 6-2 victory in the contest with 12 different players contributing points. **Alex Lyon** played the first two periods in goal and stopped 17 of 19 shots, while **Trey Augustine** played the third period and did not allow a goal on four shots. Team USA made the 3.5-hour bus ride to Ostrava on May 8 mid-morning and did not skate. The U.S. had a 50-minute practice session on May 9 just before noon.

## WHAT'S IN A NICKNAME

Team USA assistant coach **Derek Lalonde**, who is the head coach of the NHL's Detroit Red Wings, has long had the nickname "Newsy" after Hockey Hall-of-Famer Edouard "Newsy" Lalonde. When the NHL was forming in 1917, "Newsy" Lalonde was the playing-coach and captain of the Montreal Canadiens. As a kid, Lalonde was working in a newsprint plant and that's where the original Newsy landed his nickname. For Derek Lalonde, it was his teammates at SUNY-Cortland, where he was a standout goaltender, who tabbed him "Newsy," a nickname that has carried with him since.

## TEAM USA'S ALL-TIME MEN'S WORLDS MEDALS

The U.S. has won 13 medals in the men's world championship, earning gold once (1933), silver four times (1950, 1939, 1934, 1931) and bronze on eight occasions (2021, 2018, 2015, 2013, 2004, 1996, 1952, 1949). Of Team USA's eight bronze medals, six were claimed by winning bronze-medal games while two came via tournament standings and round-robin play.

## BROCK NELSON'S GOLDEN FAMILY

**Brock Nelson's** uncle Dave Christian was a member of the 1980 gold medal-winning "Miracle On Ice" Olympic Hockey Team. In addition, his grandfather, Bill Christian and great uncle, Roger Christian, were both on the 1960 gold-medal-winning U.S. Olympic Team and another great uncle, Gordon Christian, played for the U.S. at the 1956 Olympic Winter Games where the team won the silver medal. Brock's middle name is ... you guessed it ... Christian.

## CZECH CONNECTION

Three players -- **Seth Jones**, **Brock Nelson** and **Alex Lyon** -- were part of Team USA in the 2015 IIHF Men's World Championship in Ostrava and Prague. The U.S. earned a bronze medal in the event. The U.S. played its preliminary round games in Ostrava. In the 2020 IIHF World Junior Championship, **Cole Caufield**, **Shane Pinto** and **Trevor Zegras** were part of Team USA and played preliminary round games in Ostrava. The U.S. finished sixth. And in the 2012 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship held in Brno, Czech Republic, in 2012, the U.S. earned gold with **Seth Jones** part of that team.

## MIKE SULLIVAN

**Mike Sullivan** was named head coach of the 2026 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team on May 18 as well as the bench boss for the U.S. Men's National Team that will play in the 2025 4 Nations Face-Off. Sullivan has been a head coach in the NHL for 11 seasons, including the last nine with the Pittsburgh Penguins where he has guided the team to a pair of Stanley Cup titles. Sullivan has represented in the U.S. in the IIHF Men's World Championship in as a player in 1997, as head coach in 2007 and as assistant coach in 2008. Sullivan and Bill Guerin, general manager of both teams, arrived here in Ostrava on May 19 and are here for the duration of the world championship. Guerin is the GM of the NHL's Minnesota Wild.

## MARK WELLS PASSING

**Mark Wells**, who played center for the gold medal-winning 1980 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team, passed away on May 17. The story of the 1980 team's stunning run to the gold medal has been lauded as the greatest sports moment of the 20th century by *Sports Illustrated* and the #1 story in the first 100 years of the IIHF.

## PRO HOCKEY COUPLE

**Luke Kunin**, who plays for the NHL's San Jose Sharks, is married to the former Sophia Shaver, who plays for PWHL Minnesota. Sophia was part of the gold medal-winning 2015 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team and played collegiately at the University of Wisconsin where she met Luke. Both were captains of their respective UW hockey teams.

## WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP IN CZECH

The 2024 IIHF Men's World Championship marks the 10th time the event is being staged in Czechia/Czech Republic/Czechoslovakia. Team USA has won three medals here in Czechia previously, including gold in 1933 and bronze in both 2004 and 2015.
