Kerry Weiland is an American ice hockey defenseman, born on October 18, 1980, in Anchorage, Alaska, United States. Kerry strongly believes that sports provide valuable life lessons. She grew up on a farm in Palmer, Alaska and started playing hockey at age 5. She played Varsity Boys' ice hockey at Palmer High School and became the first female to earn First Team All-Region honors in Alaskan history. Kerry served as the Assistant Captain her Junior year and was Captain her Senior season.
