## 2025 IIHF WOMEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

The U.S. Women's National Team is one of 10 teams competing at the 2025 International Ice Hockey Federation Women's World Championship from April 9-20 in Ceske Budejovice, Czechia.

The tournament features ten teams divided into two groups of five. Team USA is competing in Group A alongside, Canada, Czechia, Switzerland and Finland. Group B includes Germany, Hungary, Japan, Norway and Sweden. Each group will play a single round-robin series before the playoff round.

## WOMEN'S WORLDS SUCCESS

The U.S. has earned gold or silver in every IIHF Women's World Championship since the inception of the event in 1990. The U.S. has made the title game in all 23 tournaments staged.

## LAST TIME OUT

It was a record breaking Knight as the U.S. topped Switzerland, 5-0, in the final preliminary round game of the 2025 IIHF Women's World Championship. **Hilary Knight** recorded three assists to set a new IIHF Women's World Championship assist record, as **Kendall Coyne Schofield** and **Tessa Janecke** each tallied two goals each. **Gwyneth Philips** and **Ava McNaughton** combined for a six-save shutout.

## QUICK SHOTS

### TODAY'S MATCH UP

Today's game marks Team USA's quarterfinal matchup of the 2025 IIHF Women's World Championship. The U.S. enters the day with a 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record having beaten all its preliminary round opponents to win group A and enter the playoff round as the top overall seed.

### ALL TIME AGAINST GERMANY

Today's game is just the eighth all-time Women's Worlds meeting between the U.S. and Germany. Team USA holds an undefeated 8-0-0-0 record against Germany and have outscored them 74-2 in those meetings.

### LAST TIME AGAINST GERMANY

The U.S. and Germany last met in the quarterfinal round of the 2023 IIHF Women's World Championship on April 13, 2023. Aerin Frankel made 18 saves en route to her first shutout in net as a member of the U.S. Women's National Team.

### IN THE QUARTERFINALS

The U.S. holds a perfect 5-0-0-0 record all time in quarterfinal games at Women's Worlds and have outscored opponents 37-3 in those meetings. Prior to the tournament being reformatted in 2019, the U.S. had never played in a quarterfinal content at the championship, having earned a bye to the semifinal round in all previous competitions.

### KNIGHT BREAKS WOMEN'S WORLDS ALL-TIME ASSIST RECORD

**Hilary Knight's** third assist in Tuesday's win against Switzerland marked her 50th career Women's World Championship assist, setting a new IIHF record for all-time assists at a Women's World Championship. Canada's Hayley Wickenheiser previously held the record with 49 career assists. **Kendall Coyne Schofield** sits third all-time with 48 assists.

### COYNE SECOND IN ALL-TIME U.S. POINTS AT WORLDS

**Kendall Coyne Schofield** currently has 79 all time points in Women's Worlds play, following a two-goal night on Tuesday. That passes Cammi Granato for second-most points in Team USA history at the tournament. Granato now sits third with 78 career Women's Worlds points.

### A CLEAN SHEET

Team USA did not commit a penalty in Tuesday's win over Switzerland. It marked the first time since April 12, 2009, a game against Canada, that the U.S. went penalty free in a Women's Worlds game.

### WILGREN AND MCNAUGHTON MAKE DEBUT

It was a night of debuts during Tuesday's victory over Switzerland. Defender **Anna Wilgren** made her IIHF Women's World Championship debut, as did goaltender **Ava McNaughton**, who saw 28:56 of action in net.

## TEAM USA AT A GLANCE

### ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The 2025 U.S. Women's National Team features 25 players, 14 forwards, eight defenders and three goaltenders, and boasts 21 returnees from the 2024 team that took home silver. **Ava McNaughton** and **Anna Wilgren** are slated to make their U.S. Women's National Team debut.

### LEADERSHIP CORE RETURNS

**Hilary Knight** (Sun Valley, Idaho) is the captain of Team USA for the 2025 IIHF Women's World Championship. **Alex Carpenter** (North Reading, Mass.) and **Megan Keller** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) returns as alternate captains.

### BEHIND THE BENCH

**John Wroblewski** is the head coach of the 2025 U.S. Women's National Team. **Shari Dickerman**, **Brent Hill** and **Josh Sciba** are serving as assistant coaches, while **Alli Altmann** is the team's goaltending coach.

### 2022 U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM RETURNEES

In total, 13 players on this year's team were members of the 2022 U.S. Olympic Team that took home silver in Beijing. Olympians include, **Cayla Barnes, Alex Carpenter, Jesse Compher, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Savannah Harmon, Caroline Harvey, Megan Keller, Hilary Knight, Abbey Murphy, Kelly Pannek, Hayley Scamurra, Lee Stecklein** and **Grace Zumwinkle**.

### WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM NEWCOMERS

**Ava McNaughton** and **Anna Wilgren** were named to the U.S. Women's National Team for the first time and will be making their international debuts in Czechia. McNaughton most recently was a member of the U.S. Collegiate Women's Select Team during the Six Nations Tournament in Finland, while Anna Wilgren represented the U.S. at the 2024-25 Rivalry Series.

### FIFTEENTH GO AROUND

Forward **Hilary Knight** is appearing in her record 15th IIHF Women's World Championship, the most in USA Hockey history and second-most in IIHF history. Knight has led Team USA to gold nine times (2008, 2009, 2011, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019, 2023) and silver five times (2007, 2012, 2021, 2022, 2024). She owns the IIHF record for all-time WWC points (111) and goals (65).

### ELEVENTH APPEARANCE FOR COYNE SCHOFIELD

Forward **Kendall Coyne Schofield** is playing in her eleventh IIHF Women's World Championship, the second-most WWC appearances in USA Hockey history. Coyne Schofield has won six golds (2011, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019) and four silvers (2012, 2021, 2022, 2024).

### TENTH WORLDS FOR CARPENTER

Forward **Alex Carpenter** is playing in her tenth IIHF Women's World Championship. She's been a part of six gold-medal winning teams (2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019, 2023) and three silver-medal winning teams (2021, 2022, 2024).

### STECKLEIN RETURNS

Defender **Lee Stecklein** returns to the U.S. Women's National Team for the first time since the 2023 IIHF Women's World Championship for her ninth World Championship appearance. Stecklein, a three-time Olympian, has lead the blue line to

### COLLEGE CONNECTION

All 25 athletes on the Team USA roster have competed or are currently competing as women's hockey student-athletes at a U.S. college or university. The University of Wisconsin leads the way with nine athletes, the most from one school to represent Team USA at any Women's Worlds. The University of Minnesota has five, while Northeastern University has four. Boston College, Clarkson University and Ohio State University each have two while Penn State University has one. In total, seven different schools have representation on the team.

### PATTY KAZMAIER MEMORIAL AWARD HONOREES

Four members of the team have been honored with the Patty Kazmaier Memorial Award, bestowed annually to the best women's player in NCAA Division I college hockey: **Taylor Heise** (2022), **Aerin Frankel** (2021), **Kendall Coyne Schofield** (2016) and **Alex Carpenter** (2015).

### U18 WOMEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP ALUMNI

A total of 19 players on the 2024 U.S. Women's National Team represented the U.S. at an IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, including **Cayla Barnes, Alex Carpenter, Jesse Compher, Kendall Coyne Schofield, Britta Curl-Salemme, Joy Dunne, Lacey Eden, Laila Edwards, Caroline Harvey, Taylor Heise, Tessa Janecke, Megan Keller, Ava McNaughton, Abbey Murphy, Kelly Pannek, Kirsten Simms, Lee Stecklein, Haley Winn** and **Grace Zumwinkle**. Dunne was most recently on the U18 team in 2023.

### WNT ALUMNI TAKE DEVELOPMENT ROLES

U.S. Women's National Team alumni **Ellen Hughes** and **Haley Skarupa** have joined the team staff in a development capacity this season. Hughes is the team's player development consultant, while Skarupa is the team scout. Hughes played on the 1992 U.S. Women's National Team, while Skarupa won gold with Team USA at the 2018 Olympic Winter Games.

### PWHL REPRESENTATION

All six PWHL teams are represented on Team USA's roster. There are six players on the Minnesota Frost. Three players on the Boston Fleet and Toronto Sceptres, two on the Montreal Victorie, and one player on both the New York Sirens and Ottawa Charge.

### THE UNITED STATES OF WISCONSIN?

It's a year of hosting for USA Hockey as the organization will host the 2025 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship in Frisco and Allen, Texas from April 23-May 3, 2025.

### 2025 WORLD PARA ICE HOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the first time since 2015, the World Para Ice Hockey Championships will return to the United States. Buffalo, N.Y., will host this year's event at the LECOM Harborcenter from May 24-31. It marks the first time the U.S. has hosted the event in 10 years, 2015 also in Buffalo.

### 2026 IIHF WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

USA Hockey announced that Saint Paul and Minneapolis, will serve as host of the 2026 IIHF World Junior Championship. The 2026 event marks the 50th anniversary of the IIHF World Junior Championship. Xcel Energy Center, home of the NHL's Minnesota Wild in Saint Paul, and 3M Arena at Mariucci on the University of Minnesota campus in Minneapolis, will serve as the competition venues. Tickets are on sale for the World Junior Championship now.

### TEAM USA HONORS GAUDREAU BROTHERS

USA Hockey is honoring the legacy of American hockey players Johnny and Matthew Gaudreau, who tragically passed away on Aug. 29. The men's, women's and sled national teams, along with the two teams part of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program will wear helmet decals for the season. The decal artwork includes stars floating towards the heavens with the Gaudreau name and the jersey numbers of Johnny (13) and Matthew (21).

## 2025 U.S. WOMEN'S NATIONAL TEAM STAFF



### JOHN WROBLEWSKI, HEAD COACH

John Wroblewski is serving as the head coach of the U.S. Women's National Team for the 2024-25 season after leading Team USA to a gold medal at the 2023 IIHF Women's World Championship and silver at the 2022 WWC and 2024 WWC.

Wroblewski joined the U.S. Women's National Team following two years (2020-22) as the head coach of the Ontario (Calif.) Reign, the AHL affiliate of the LA Kings, and four seasons (2016-20) as the bench boss of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

Over his four years with the NTDP, the program reached its first USHL playoff berth since 2012 and finished top-three in all 12 international tournaments played. He led his team to 33-consecutive international victories from 2016-18, and also oversaw the development of 29 NHL Draft picks, including Jack Hughes, who was selected first overall by the New Jersey Devils in 2019.

At the IIHF level, Wroblewski guided the U.S. Under-18 Men's National Team twice, resulting in a gold in 2017 and bronze in 2019.

The Neenah, Wisconsin, native began his coaching career as an intern assistant coach with the NTDP and was promoted to a full-time assistant coach the following season, a position he held from 2008-10.

Wroblewski, a player on the inaugural NTDP roster in 1997, skated four years with the University of Notre Dame (1999-2003). He went on to play four years (2003-07) professionally with the ECHL's Fresno Falcons, recording 125 points (65-60) in 273 career games.

## ASSISTANT COACHES

### SHARI DICKERMAN, ASSISTANT COACH

Shari Dickerman is returning as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team during the 2024-25 season, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

Dickerman, who is in her first season as head coach at Minnesota State University, previously served as assistant coach of the 2022 U.S. Collegiate Women's Select Team, that competed at the 2022 Collegiate Series against Canada in August. Prior to her appointment to the USA Hockey staff, Dickerman served as an evaluator at numerous USA Hockey camps.

A member of the Mavericks staff since 2009, Dickerman has helped lead Minnesota State for the last 15 seasons and was named head coach in March 2024.

As a player, Dickerman was an All-American goaltender for the Mavericks.

### BRENT HILL, ASSISTANT COACH

Brent Hill is returning as an assistant coach for the U.S. Women's National Team during the 2024-25 season, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

Hill is currently serving as an assistant coach of the Quinnipiac Women's Ice Hockey team, a role he's held for the last two seasons.

Hill was on the bench as an assistant coach for the 2015 U.S. Under-18 Women's World Championship, leading the squad to a gold medal at the 2015 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship.

Prior to Quinnipiac, Hill spent four seasons at the helm of Bishop Kearny Selects Academy, following a season as an assistant coach at Merrimack University and four seasons as an assistant coach at RPI.

### JOSH SCIBA, ASSISTANT COACH

Josh Sciba is reprising his role on the U.S. Women's National Team staff during the 2024-25 season, after serving in the same capacity since the 2022-23 season.

As an assistant coach, Sciba helped lead the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team to a gold medal at the 2022 IIHF Under-18 Women's World Championship, after serving in the same capacity for the 2019 U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team.

Sciba is in his first season as assistant coach for the New York Sirens, following a six-year stint as head coach of Union College.

As a player, Sciba was a member of the USA Hockey National Team Development Program from 2001-03, prior to playing four years at the University of Notre Dame.

### ALLI ALTMANN, GOALTENDING COACH

Alli Altmann returns as the goaltending coach of the U.S. Women's National Team after serving on the U.S. Women's National Team staff for the last four seasons (2021-2025).

Altmann also guided the U.S. Under-18 Women's National Team for four seasons, having served in the goaltending coach role from 2017-22. She guided the U.S. to two golds and two silvers during that time.

Altmann is currently the co-owner and vice president of DEVENIR Goaltenders. She played four seasons for Minnesota State University, recording a career .901 save percentage.
