2. Roll Call – J. Tirocke

Sixteen voting members are present, there is quorum.

3. Association Reports – All

Winter reports were received from IAHA President, RMD Registrar, Treasurer, Boise-IIW, Jr Steelheads, SVYH, CDA Academy, CDAHA, LCAHA, MYHA, SHA and the Tournament and Membership Committees. Reports are attached at the end of these minutes.

4. President's Report – J. Heinrich

There were good discussions of diversity and inclusion at the USAH Winter Meeting. John encouraged associations to think of ways to bring a greater diversity of people to rinks and hockey. Hispanic and Native American populations in Idaho are not well represented on the ice in our communities.

5. Treasurer's Report – K. Tanner

IAHA was audited by USAH about a week after the Fall meeting and survived with only a few recommendations. This was a regularly scheduled audit. Financially, the affiliate is doing well. Affiliate can order gear as an entity and then distribute if there are not a lot of grant applications. USAH does not need receipts until Annual Congress. Don't leave money on the table.

Motion by Joanne Tirocke to extend the deadline for the USA Hockey block grants and the Idaho Growth Fund grant to March 1, 2022. Second by Kaila Tanner. Motion passed with no opposition, no abstentions.

6. Registrar's Report – D. Thompson

Darla reported on Idaho registrations numbers pulled for the January 6 USAH Winter Meeting. Numbers were up from last season. Registrars and Sarah were thanked for the ease of player birth verification and tournament sanctions.

Update from the Winter Meeting. The USA Hockey registration fee will increase for the upcoming season in response to increasing insurance costs. Cost increases will differ across youth divisions and there will be no increase for adults, coaches, and officials. SafeSport certifications renewals will be due 12 months after current certification (e.g. if SafeSport was completed in February 2022, it will be due in February 2023). Notifications of renewal deadlines will be sent 90, 60, and 30 days prior and it is expected that an automatic redline will occur for volunteers who do not complete their requirement in time but this has not been built in yet. **Programs will need to monitor the portal and ensure only eligible volunteers are participating.**

Sixteen teams participating in HS Nationals and acceptance letters have gone out. HS Team National Selection criteria had been requested by Darla but had not been received as of this meeting. Comments were made that the selection process should be available in September/October and teams should have the criteria in-hand by the time they need to declare. A new HS National selection committee was in place for the 2021 -2022 season. IAHA associations would like to bring the issue of the transparency and availability of the selection criteria for HS National Tournament to the table at Annual Congress.

Darla reviewed the National Tournament requirements for teams with NTB intentions and the deadline for the submission of documents as well as the requirements for state tournament teams. All games for NTB must be completed before books are submitted.

11. Coach-in-Chief Report – J. DiSanza

Jim reported on Player Development Camp. The schedule of ice times was ready and parent meeting was scheduled for Thursday, 7 PM via Zoom. Registration was open and a few participants had already registered. Nothing set up yet for 2008 boys at the district level yet. No multi-district for 2008 girls so no path forward for these players. Participants can register right through Friday night though teams are formed by the Tuesday/Wednesday preceding camp.

Exemption info is on the website(<https://www.idahoamateurlhockey.com/page/show/802466-state-camp-exempt-policy>). They are generally problems and it's hard to evaluate players not in attendance. An exemption is not an automatic in for selection. There is something about a player that shows up and puts in the work but can evaluate exempted players when necessary through coaching network and having seen players compete. IAHA does want to represent its talent properly and needs the best players from the state moving to districts or we risk the district cutting our player allocations. No need for underage players to participate in PDC.

PDC dates this season conflict with upper level girls participation in a league tournament. An exemption for girls for high level hockey events may be warranted since these events are limited.

The option of hosting 2 PDC camps, one in the north and one in the south, was raised again to allow an alternate date for participation and reduce exemptions. The ability to recruit the necessary evaluators and the cost to host 2 camps is prohibitory. There isn't much evidence that 2 dates in the same limited time frame would decrease the number of exemptions. Later dates in March seem to work ok.

7. Referee-In-Chief Report – B. Noyes

Across hockey nation, there has been renewed emphasis on Zero Tolerance. In New Hampshire, there is a spectator conduct reporting system so on-ice officials don't have to worry about identifying violators of USA Hockey rules and codes of conduct. With this system, there is some recourse for others to monitor their parents and visiting spectators. It has been suggested that each team names a representative to help keep parents in check and hold them accountable for any abusive and disruptive behavior.

This being a rule-change year, there is some confusion about which rules are being applied in a game, causing some frustration and spectator misbehavior. Tournament Director has responsibility to clearly convey rules to officials and teams. Are we throwing too many inexperienced officials into difficult situation? Onus is on parents/spectators to behave appropriately and if they can't, should have team rep that calls them out. There is always one parent who won't shut up.

Tournament sanctions often have Zero Tolerance Policy in their rules. Tournament Director then has rules to stand behind. This has been effective in at least one venue. Clearly post expectations, educate offenders, and communicate consequences. Try positive peer pressure and if necessary, call the cops.

Recruiting efforts may be helped by investment in our state's young officials, a budget allocation for youth officials' gear and registration fees was suggested or by paying them more.

8. Girls Hockey Report - L. Schlake/ S. Benson

Girls player numbers are up this year, but the number of girls teams is down. There are 4 – 5 19U teams but not enough 14U nor 12U teams across the state. Girls are choosing to play on their youth teams for state tournaments so there aren't enough girls for girls teams. Two Idaho Viper teams (19U, 16U) have declared NTB. Having the girls state tournament on an alternate weekend would mean an opportunity for girls to participate in a state tournament with their girls teams.

9. State Tournaments – S. Benson/ J. Heinrich

Only one page of participating teams had been sent, a second page showed declared HS teams. The number of declared teams was reviewed for each tournament. Tournament Committee

had an upcoming meeting. Team costs would be available the following week. Reminder to teams with Championship Trophies to have them engraved for last season and bring them along to the tournament.

Looking for a mechanism to see if Board would allow the participation of 2 local teams in the state tournament and also maintain their NTB status. According to new guidebook rules approved and implemented for the 2021-2022 season, NTB teams would not be eligible to participate in state tournaments. The thinking is that teams only get to participate in one post-season event, either state tournament or NTB tournament, not both. Neither Donna nor Darla could identify a single affiliate that allows both NTB and non-NTB teams to play in the same tournament. Because teams had already declared as NTB, they did not want to pull their declarations and be subject to any penalties. Waivers were not an option. Comment was made that it is detrimental for small IAHA programs to have to compete with NTB teams. The teams in question are locally formed, not recruited.

The general consensus was that the newly written rule was not understood at the time of its approval to mean that teams declaring as NTB would be excluded from state tournaments. It was acknowledged that conducting a Special Meeting to decide whether teams declared for the state tournament and that were also declared NTB could participate in the state tournament would be acceptable. The participation of Idaho Falls 18U team at State Tournament and the participation of Sun Valley's HS team at the HS Championship were at stake.

10. Committee Reports

A. Discipline Committee – S. Benson

Quite a few match penalties, both youth and adult. Buford Howell has volunteered to serve as a committee member.

B. Membership Committee – J. Tirocke

New Member and new Associate Member applications are due March 8. Current Membership Organization Checklists are due by April 30.

C. Nominating Committee – L. Schlake

Three positions up for election this May are Vice President, Secretary, and At-Large Director. Nominations were due by April 16 to Lee Ann.

12. Old Business

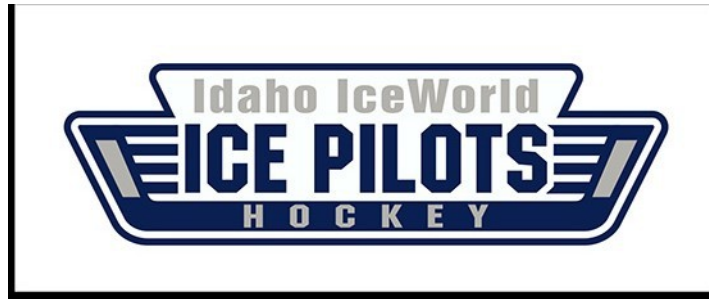
Approval of Fall Minutes – J. Tirocke

Winter/Spring 2022 -- IAHA Report

Lewis Clark Amateur Hockey Association had a successful 2021-22 season.

We are up this season from last year nearing 100 players. We had one house team at the following age divisions – Jr. Mites, Sr. Mites, Squirts, Bantams and Midgets. In addition, we were able to put together a PeeWee (Jets) travel team consisting of mostly Moscow, LC, and McCall players. Our house teams participated in the Inland Northwest Hockey league that was successfully formed four years ago and we plan to participate in it again next season. Furthermore, our Midget team has declared for High School State. This past season all of our teams had a mix of female and male players and we anticipate that consistency again next season.

We participated in one Try Hockey For Free Event this season and had outstanding numbers with over 20 kids. Furthermore, in the fall of 2021 we continued with an in house local Learn to Play Hockey program, in which we had 35 kids sign up. With this we were able to recruit several players to commit to the association by mid-season. Nevertheless, we have found these programs to be a great way to introduce our local youth to the sport of hockey in our smaller area. We confidently see the sport of hockey growing in our local area. Nevertheless, in the past three years we have continuously seen outside recruitment of our players from other larger rep organizations. In 2019-20 LC lost about 11 players to other programs. On the otherhand, in 2021-2022 season we had about 8 players return back to our association. This explains a little higher average of players for the past season. Despite this, LC teams have been successful and coaching has maintained its quality.

In the early fall season we were faced a difficult situation with the PeeWee team. With basically not enough players to form a team we worked very hard to find places for these kids to practice and get ice time. As the year progressed, we have now been able to jumble a team together and in turn get these kids some games. Not a lot but a few. Thus, the PeeWee program has managed to slide by in 2020-21.

We have been continuing to work with our association parents and players to expand our referee program. We provided some incentives again this past season in an attempt to get more participation. This was successful with several new referees passing the certification, but we still struggle with having enough referees to meet demand. It is a journey to build a strong numbered competent referee group.

We are consistently working with the IAHA President in the process of bettering LCAHA. Coaching education, player development, goalie coaching options and parental behavior are just a few of the things we jointly maintain on our radar. We have maintained 2 new younger level coaches, and added one new coach with hockey experience for this 2021-2022 season. With this we will be providing coaching education in different aspects to assist these new volunteers. Furthermore, we are always open to having the IAHA ADM coaching staff come to Lewiston to provide education for our coaching staff.

Our association is again undergoing a significant review of our processes and documentation of these processes. This season the newly elected board will be continuing to revise the Bylaws/handbooks (ect). We fully recognize our issues with this and have a strategic plan for completion but sometimes this takes time in these volunteer scenarios.

Mid Season we lost two key board members for personal reasons. We have been unable to fill those positions due to the lack of interest. Thus, we hope to elect new board members at our March Association meeting and they will take the reins in June for the coming season:

MYHA Successes

Hockey season in McCall is in full swing. Our numbers are higher than they have been in a long time. All teams are travelling regularly to tournaments. This is the first season that each division is having a home tournament. We have not been able to field a full High School team until this year to have a home tournament so we are really excited about the momentum here. The High school tournament was last weekend and was really well attended by the local High School kids, everyone is excited! Our Mites and Squirt numbers are really high mostly due to our efforts recruiting new younger kids. Our grow the game coordinator has done a great job inventing fun events to get new kids on the ice. The covid situation is up and down in McCall like everywhere in Idaho. Our protocols seem to be working as no outbreaks have happened due to Hockey, we haven't missed any tournaments, and our parents have been good at not sending sick kids to practice. We recently contracted a grant coordinator and she has been helpful in searching for program funds to help with ice costs, equipment needs, and scholarships.

MYHA Issues

Finding refs remains our largest concern in McCall. Almost all of our refs for the older teams now come from other places requiring our teams to accommodate lodging and meals. This is a financial burden on the program and doesn't seem to be getting better. We are trying to schedule a ref clinic in McCall in the near future and have discussed subsidizing individuals who want to become a ref. McCall being such a small community always struggles with athlete numbers in the older age groups. We are having problems with tournament conflicts when an athlete is playing for multiple teams it leaves one team short handed. For example we have athletes playing for Bantams and High School and both teams need them for an adequate bench. Duel rostering and how to keep everyone happy is always a topic at our board meetings and does cause some problems that are hard to solve.

SVYH Winter Report: January 2022

SVYH continues to grow. We have registered over 300 players this season. Our Mity and Squirt teams each have over 50 players. We offered a trial period (4 weeks) for new players of the 25 players that signed up for this program 20 chose to continue for the rest of the season. We have teams in every age division. We have fielded both a Varsity and JV High School teams this season. Our Varsity High School team has declared for Nationals.

Our girls program continues to grow which is very exciting. We have 19U, 14U and 12U girls' teams. However, we are very frustrated that there are not more 14U teams to play in Idaho and deeply disappointed that there will not be a 14U division for the girls at State. We hope that IAHA will help work towards better opportunities for the 14U girls within our state.

We will host tournaments for all our teams. We are also ready to host both the IAHA State and HS State Championships.

This season we were able to grant over \$8,000 in scholarships to players. We continue to work on growing our scholarship capacity and diversity within our program.

Our partnership with OverSpeed continues to support the growth of SVYH. OverSpeed has conducted in-season clinics, worked with each of our teams, and developed goalie clinics for our players. OverSpeed also hosted a Thanksgiving camp that was open to the public.

SVYH continues to navigate Covid to the best of our abilities and keep our players healthy as possible. In January many players have tested positive for Covid as it is very rampant in our local community at the moment. Unfortunately, two of our teams have had to cancel their travel/tournament plans because of Covid cases and exposures on their teams.

SVYH looks forward to the rest of the hockey season.

Idaho Winter Meeting
Registrar Report
January 26, 2022

Idaho registrations for youth and adult as of January 6, 2022, were 4,015. In the 2020-2021 season numbers were 3,339 up 676. Female players as of January 6, 2022, were 809. 2020-2021 season had 631 up 178 from last season. 574 unclaimed players in Idaho. I would encourage each program registrar to claim your unclaimed players in the portal. We have sanctioned 51 tournament sanctions for the 2021-2022 season.

Registrars have done a fabulous job getting birth certificates verified and rosters submitted in a timely manner.

Idaho has sanctioned 51 tournaments as of January 21, 2022 and approved 194 rosters.

Updates from Winter Meeting:

Registration Fee Increase:

- Over a 20-season period, there have been just three fee increases. The most recent fee increases occurred in 2005 at \$5, 2011 at \$10 and 2019 at \$6.
- Insurance cost has increased 30% over the last year.
- Due to global pandemic, normal increases in expenses, and increased inflation well above historical averages, has created an environment where the dollar does not go as far.
- Legal costs to defend USA Hockey and its affiliates from lawsuits and legal action continue to increase and require additional resources.

In order to serve our membership and effectively operate the organization, USA Hockey is in need of a fee increase for the 2022-23 season.

During WM in Florida, the following fee structure was voted on which will begin in the 2022-2023 season.

Current Fee Structure:

\$46 for any player/coach that is age 7 or above

2022-2023 Season fees

- 6U participants at \$15 (*currently \$0*)
- 7/8 participants at \$50 (*currently \$46*)
- 9-12 participants at \$61 (*currently \$46*)
- 13-18 participants at \$70 (*currently \$46*)
- Adult, coaches, officials – NO INCREASE (currently \$46.00) birth year 2003 and older

SafeSport Update:

SafeSport will move from hockey season to every 12 months for individuals to take SafeSport. If you take SafeSport in Feb. 2022, you will be required to take SafeSport again in Feb 2023. Coaches/players sitting on rosters that do not have SafeSport completed will be redlined and not eligible to participate. We are hoping that the system will automatically redline individuals who are not in compliance however this has not been built into the 2022-2023 portal as of today.

30/60/90 day notification will be sent from the National office then coach will be redlined and not able to participate until SafeSport is completed.

High School Selection Process:

16 Teams per division for HS Nationals. Teams are not guaranteed a spot for Nationals even if they are the only team in Affiliate. Acceptance letters went out to teams last week.

Criteria on how HS teams are selected will be provided to us

Idaho State Playdown Credentials: (February 11-13, 2022)

Teams participating in Idaho State playdown games which determine the team representing Idaho at Nationals will need to email their teams credentials no later than February 4th, 2022. Teams participating in the Idaho State play down, District tournament or the USA Hockey National tournament teams will need to meet their 20/10 (youth), 14/10 (girls) or 10/5 (high school).

- Consent To Treat for all players, coaches and volunteers listed on your 1T roster.
- Game sheets for games listed on you CVS.

Our registration numbers are up for Youth, almost 4% over the national average. We have over 4000 registered players for the first time and are only 4 Girls behind Arizona (809 to 813). Believe it or not we are only a few Officials short of our 2019-20 numbers. That may sound good, but we were low then and are low now making it hard to meet our tournament needs.

Diversity and Inclusion

There was a lot of discussion about D & I at the Winter Meeting and not enough input on solutions. Granted every community has its own challenges in attracting diverse players in their area. I will ask all of you to get creative and look around and figure out what would work in your backyard. More on this at the meeting.

New Beginnings

I don't want to steal the Palouse's thunder, but I'm excited about their new rink opening this fall. I would like to have IAHA involved with their opening. Have Kory go up and do some ADM drills with their kids and coaches. Somehow assist in the celebration of their newest community asset. How can we help? It would be an opportunity to highlight their rink's diverse player base as well.
