## **I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW**

The Skate Vegas Championships will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the [current rulebook](#), and [current Compete USA handbook](#) as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating [website](#).

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, Learn to Skate USA® member, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the [rulebook](#) for more information.

### **SERIES INFORMATION:**

The 2026 Skate Vegas Championships has been designated as an Excel Series competition for the 2026 Excel Series.

Skaters entered in the Excel Series at eligible levels will earn points for their placements. Skaters must register to participate in the Excel Series prior to competing in designated competitions to have their points recorded and seen in the standings.

## **II. ELIGIBILITY**

### **Singles: Excel and Well-Balanced Events:**

- Skaters must meet at least the minimum singles test requirements for the event's level. A skater's singles test level may be higher than the minimum requirement.
  - o Skate Up: skaters may skate up one level higher than their minimum test requirement allows.
- Skaters may not register for an event level lower than allowed by their competitive floor. An athlete's competitive floor is set by one of the following scenarios:
  - o If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the NQS series, the event level registered for in the most recent NQS will become the lowest level they may compete at in any U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event.
  - o If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the Excel Series, the event level registered for in the most recent Excel series will become the lowest level they may compete in any Excel event. For Well-Balanced and Specialty events the skater will be permitted to register at one level lower than the "floor" set by their excel series entry.
  - o If an athlete has never had a paid EMS series application in the NQS or Excel series, the athlete may select their level based on their goals and technical skills as long as the minimum test requirements are met.
- Skaters are not permitted to enter an Excel free skate and a Well-Balanced free skate event at the same competition (example: Juvenile Girls Free Skate and Juvenile Girls Excel Free Skate). However, they are permitted to enter an Excel and a Well-Balanced event of different types such as a short program (if stand-alone event option), specialty or showcase events (example: Intermediate Women Short Program and Intermediate Women Excel Free Skate).

### **All other singles and partner events (such as Adults, Pairs, Ice Dance):**

- Skaters must meet the minimum test requirements for the events level but not exceed the maximum permissible test requirement.

### **COACHES**

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into two categories, Coach Compliance (includes choreographers) and Learn to Skate USA® Instructor Compliance. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found in [Members Only](#), click the blue “COACH” button. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

Coaches of foreign athletes: If you are a coach of a foreign athlete only, you are not subject to U.S. Figure Skating coach compliance and will only be asked to provide a letter of good standing for the federation your athlete represents.

With EMS, coaches must be included within a skater/team’s registration or updated through their EMS Skater Portal via “[My Coaches](#)” or “Team Personnel.” All coaches declared at the time of registration will be included in the registration confirmation email. Note: There is no registration approval process within EMS as the data (membership and test level) is tied to the U.S. Figure Skating database. Non-compliant coaches will receive automated email reminders through the start of the competition.

### **MANDATORY ATHLETES**

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSport™ Training. \*

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport™ Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. ### **III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION**

#### **ONLINE REGISTRATION VIA EMS (Singles and Partnered events only):**

Online registrations will be accepted via [EMS](#). Payment must be made at the time of registration by credit card only. Each transaction includes a 3% Processing Fee.

Registration Opens: Monday January 12, 2026, at 9:00am PT (12:00pm ET).

Registration Deadline: Sunday March 15, 2026, at 11:59pm PT (Monday March 16 at 2:59am ET).

**LATE Registration Deadline (if capacity allows):** Friday March 20, 2026, at 11:59pm PT (Saturday March 21 at 2:59am ET) + \$75 Late Fee.

*\*The host club reserves the right to close registration at any time prior to the above dates if event capacity is met. \**

*There will be a capacity limit for the competition, so early registration is recommended to secure your place. Registration is not complete until payment via EMS has been confirmed. Special consideration or requests for late registration for any reason after the closure of entries (whether on or before the above dates) will not be able to be accommodated.*

There will be a **\$75 change fee** for each event or level change request after the entry deadline. **NO CHANGES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER 11:59PM (PACIFIC) ON April 29<sup>th</sup>.**

#### **PARTNERED EVENTS:**

Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. **The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.**

## **FOREIGN SKATERS:**

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition ([click here for HOW TO](#)). This can be done by choosing the “Non-Member? Create Account” option on the [Members Only](#) login page.

## **TEST CREDIT:**

In accordance with Rules TR 3.00, 4.01 and 4.02, athletes may receive credit for meeting minimum scores at any competition held under the International Judge System (IJS). The athlete must “skate-up” to the event they are seeking test credit for, in addition to having already passed any prerequisites prior to the competition event.

## **Eligible Events:**

Singles Free Skate: Open Juvenile, Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior, Senior.

Athletes seeking test credit must pre-pay online by **Wednesday April 29, 2026, at 11:59pm PT (Thursday April 30, 2026, at 2:59am ET), for \$40**. At the competition, upon confirmation payment has been received, please fill out a test credit packet which can be obtained from the registration desk. These must be completed a minimum of 4 hours prior to the commencement of the skater’s event to allow enough time for accounting to process the request.

After results are finalized in the event that the athlete is seeking credit for, and if the minimum scores required have been achieved, printed results will be available for collection from the registration table. It is the athlete/coach’s responsibility to collect the completed test results prior to the end of the competition; uncollected test packets will be securely disposed of and reprinting later will not be possible. Submission of the test credit form to US Figure Skating is the responsibility of the skater in conjunction with their home club test chair.

No on-site requests for Test Credit will be accepted.

## **CRITIQUES/FEEDBACK**

Critiques/Feedback will NOT be offered.

## **MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD:**

**NO CD’s will be accepted for BACK UP Music.**

**EMS MUSIC UPLOAD:** Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to EMS no later than **11:59pm PT, Sunday April 26, 2026 (Monday April 27, 2026, at 2:59am ET)**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a **\$75 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

**DEADLINE: 11:59pm PT, Sunday April 26, 2026 (Monday April 27, 2026, at 2:59am ET).** Music uploaded after this date will be subject to a **\$75 late fee**.

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone and it must be immediately available rinkside whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

## **PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) SUBMISSION/UPLOAD – FOR IJS EVENTS ONLY:**

**EMS PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC):** Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in EMS no later than **11:59pm PT, Sunday April 26, 2026 (Monday April 27, 2026, at 2:59am ET)**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a **\$75 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

**DEADLINE: 11:59pm PT, Sunday April 26, 2026 (Monday April 27, 2026, at 2:59am ET). PPC uploaded after this date will be subject to a \$75 late fee.**

Entry fees will not be refunded after the closure of registration, unless no competition exists, or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable and disputed credit card charges will incur a \$50 fee. Payment of any fees will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

## **IV. COMPETITION DETAILS**

### **FACILITIES:**

America First Center

America First Center is located approximately 20 minutes east of the Harry Reid International airport in Henderson, NV. It is near the intersection of 2 major North-South, East-west freeways I-11/95 and 215 connecting us with LA, AZ and UT. The Arena is located on the historic Water Street District and is within walking distance to restaurants, bars, and casinos, with Target, Walmart and grocery stores nearby. Less than 30 minutes from the rink is Lake Mead, Hoover Dam and Historic Boulder City. Located in Henderson, between the Las Vegas Strip and America First Center is an area in Green Valley, known as "The District". Here you will find Green Valley Resort, Spa and Casino, Whole Foods, PF Chang's, Cheesecake Factory, Lucille's BBQ, upscale shops and a variety of other restaurants.

### **LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS:**

Locker rooms/ready rooms and changing areas will not be provided at this competition. All athletes are expected to arrive at the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc). Restrooms are available if quick changes are necessary.

### **U.S. Figure Skating Travel Policy:**

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors who are at least 8 years of age or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). ### **OFFICIAL WEBSITE & UPDATES:**

Starting Orders and Results will be posted online. QR Codes with links will be provided to the competitors and posted in the lobby. The registration table will have up-to-date information about schedule changes throughout the competition. **It is the**

**responsibility of each competitor, parent, and coach to check with the volunteers at registration for any schedule changes and/or additional information.** Skaters are requested to arrive 1 hour prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule of events will be posted prior to the competition.

## **SCHEDULE**

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

## **PRACTICE ICE:**

Practice Ice will be available during competition and times will be determined depending on event capacity. A practice ice schedule will be available once the competition schedule has been finalized. Practice ice sessions will be 20 minutes each and capped at 20 skaters. Music will not be played, and showcase props are not permitted on the ice during practice ice. Practice Ice will be available to purchase via EMS. Practice Ice sessions will be separated by level. Eligibility for sessions will be determined by the skaters registered competition level.

**Pre-Purchase:** Practice ice credits may be pre-purchased during registration, via EMS. Skaters who purchase credits during the pre-purchase period will be able to select sessions during the pre-purchase selection period, which will open after the schedule has been completed and posted.

- Maximum credits per registered event: 1
- Cost per credit: \$20

**Pre-Purchase Selection:** After the closure of entries and shortly after the competition schedule is published, skaters will receive an email with notice of the practice ice schedule and the date/time when pre-purchased credits can be scheduled via EMS.

**Open Sales:** Practice Ice sessions will be available after the schedule has been published and after the pre-purchase selection window has closed. Skaters will be able to purchase open sessions available to them, dependent on remaining available capacity.

- Maximum sessions per registered event: 1
- Cost per session: \$25
- 3 days (72 hours) after the open sales period commences the maximum session limit will be removed.

## **ONSITE CHECK-IN:**

Check-in will open 1 hour prior to the commencement of competition, in the lobby of the arena, on all days of competition. Athletes should check-in upon arrival at the arena each day that they are scheduled to compete. Please be advised that events may commence up to 30 minutes earlier than scheduled if the competition is running ahead of schedule and the competition will not be paused to wait for athletes who are not checked-in with the ice monitor rinkside when their event warm up commences.

If you are participating in a role requiring compliance, please be sure to [download or print your compliance card](#) to verify your compliance status on-site, if requested. If you believe your compliance card does not accurately reflect your compliance status, please contact [skatesafe@usfigureskating.org](mailto:skatesafe@usfigureskating.org) at least 2 business days prior to the competition for assistance.

## **AWARDS:**

Medals will be awarded to the top 4 placed skaters in all events, Gold, Silver, Bronze and Pewter. Ribbons will also be awarded to fifth and sixth place in Compete USA events. Medals will be presented by the official photographer in a podium ceremony and will take place in a designated location.

## **VOLUNTEER INFO:**

We are always grateful for the help of volunteers! Lobby registrations, Door Monitors, practice ice monitors, runners, etc. Volunteer needs and information on how to sign up will be posted at a later date on EMS.

## **VOLUNTEER COMPLIANCE:**

Reminder: Compliant positions at all U.S. Figure Skating events include LOC leadership, locker room monitors and emergency

medical providers.

### **PHOTO/VIDEO:**

Live and on-demand streaming, and sales and distribution of U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned and approved events, programs, and activities that include the playback of music is strictly prohibited.
