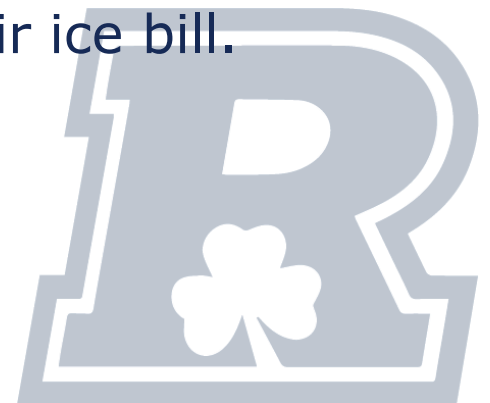

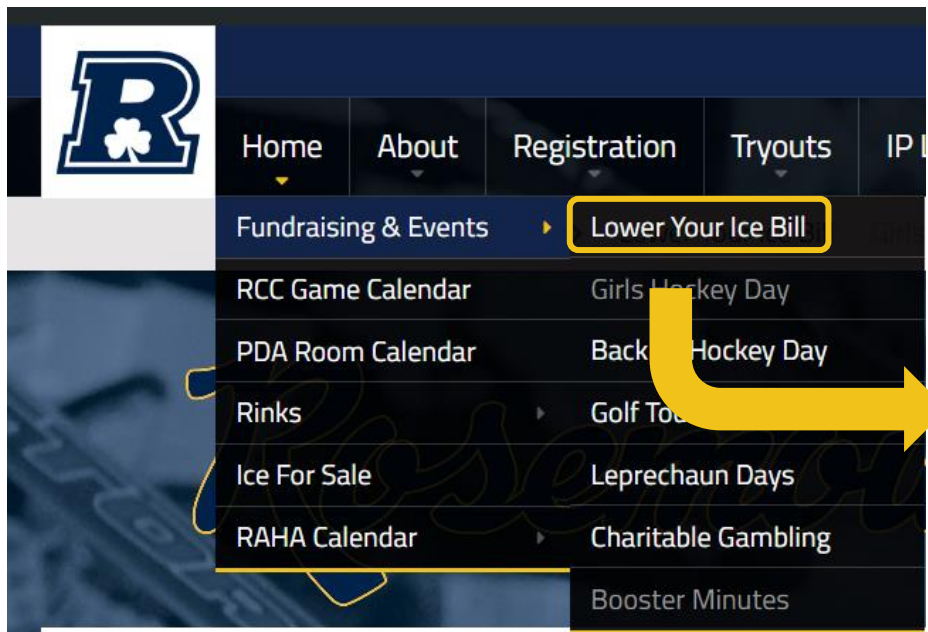

- Nitti Sanitation – New sign-ups receive an \$80 credit toward their ice bill.



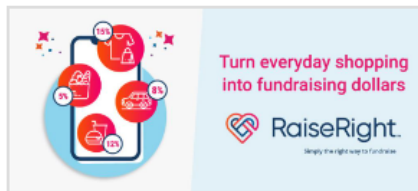

Denise DuBay

- All families **MUST** provide a check before your child gets on the ice.
- **The check should have included the names of your children participating in RAHA in the memo to ensure proper allocation:**
 - \$750 for 1 player
 - \$1000 for 2+ players
 - Post-date to April 1, 2026


- New DIBs are released monthly the last Sunday of the month

DIBS | HOW TO

- You **MUST** login using the Sports Engine account used to register your skater for volunteer hours to be appropriately allocated.
- **Only the parent who registered for the season can see and claim shifts.**
- Hours are tracked by the board and managed on the DIBs website. It is the parent's responsibility to complete their hours.



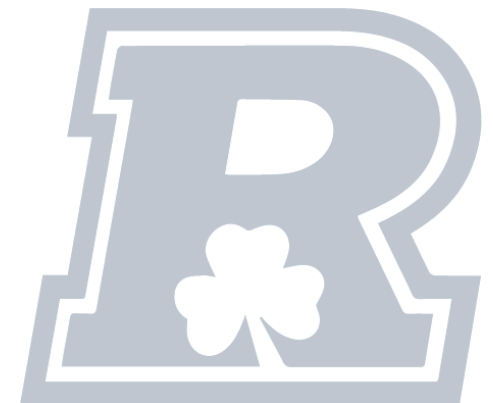

CODE OF CONDUCT | PARENT

- IP Coaches are unpaid volunteers; treat them the way you expect to be treated
- Opportunity to provide feedback during mid-and-end of season surveys

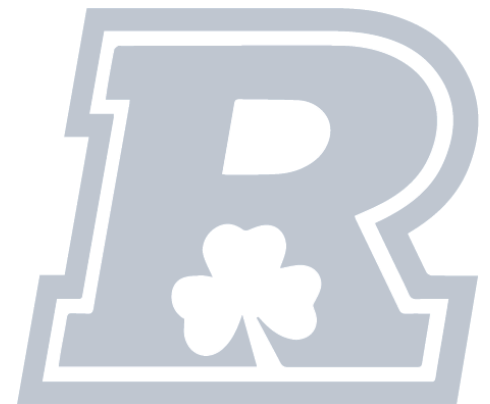
CODE OF CONDUCT | PLAYER

- Introduce skaters to hockey and progressively challenge them for the next 4-6 years
- Based on the fundamental of USA Hockey's American Development Model (ADM)
- Not a youth traveling program

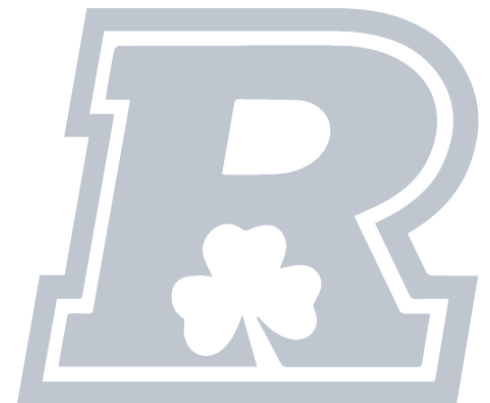


IP | TERMITES

1 TEAM | 25 players to date

- All 4-year-old boys and girls (must be 4 by June 1, 2025)
- ADM based model
- ~20 ice sessions over 17 weeks
- Practices on Saturday or Sunday
- Practices mostly held at RCC, IGH and possibly Woodbury Ice
- Team manager will be needed (5 hours of DIBs)
- First skate is weekend of November 1st
- Pictures are in December or January
- 5 volunteer hours

IP | 6U GIRLS

2 TEAMS | 27 players to date

- Kindergarten & 1st graders (5 years old by June 1, 2025)
- ADM based model
- ~34 sessions of indoor ice
- Practices on Saturday and Sunday
- Practices held at RCC, IGH and possibly Woodbury Ice
- Team managers are needed (10 hours DIBs)
- First skate is weekend of November 1/2
- Pictures are in December or January

3 TEAMS | 64 players to date

- Kindergarten & 1st graders (5 years old by June 1, 2024)
- ADM based model
- ~34 sessions of indoor ice
- Practices on Saturday and Sunday
- Practices held at RCC, IGH and possibly Woodbury Ice
- Team managers are needed (10 hours DIBs)
- First skate is weekend of November 1/2
- Pictures are in December or January



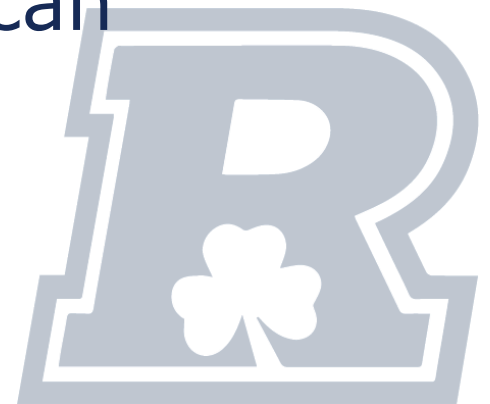

IP | MINI-MITES

Team Formation

- Equal-sized teams (dependent on number of registered skaters)
- Players will be placed on teams based on years of experience and age for the initial weekend
- Skaters will then be assessed by the coaches to finalize teams
- Outliers will be moved by the IP coordinators
- The goal is to create teams where all skaters can be challenged and develop their skills

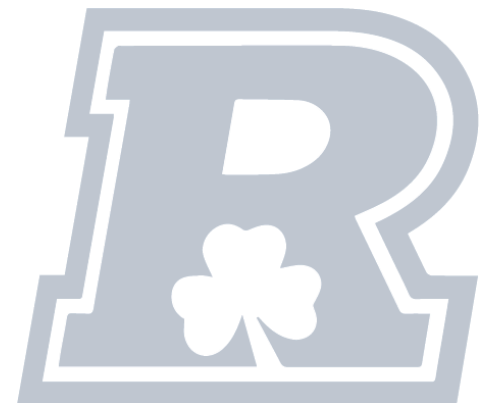

- ADM based model
- ~39 sessions of indoor ice
- Maximum of 15 scrimmages
 - 1 day of a jamboree equals 1 scrimmage
 - Max of 10 full ice events (after Jan 1st); intermediate or small nets ONLY!
- Practices on Saturday and Sunday
- Practices held at RCC, IGH and possibly Woodbury Ice
- 1 manager per team is needed (10 hours DIBs)
- First practice is weekend of November 8/9
- Pictures are in December or January

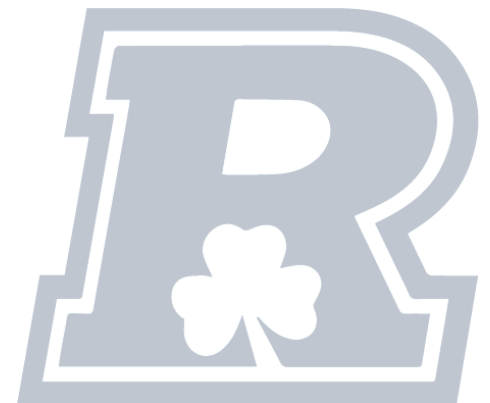

- Practices on Saturday and Sunday
- Practices held at RCC, IGH and possibly Woodbury Ice
- 1 manager per team is needed (10 hours DIBs)
- First practice is weekend of November 8/9

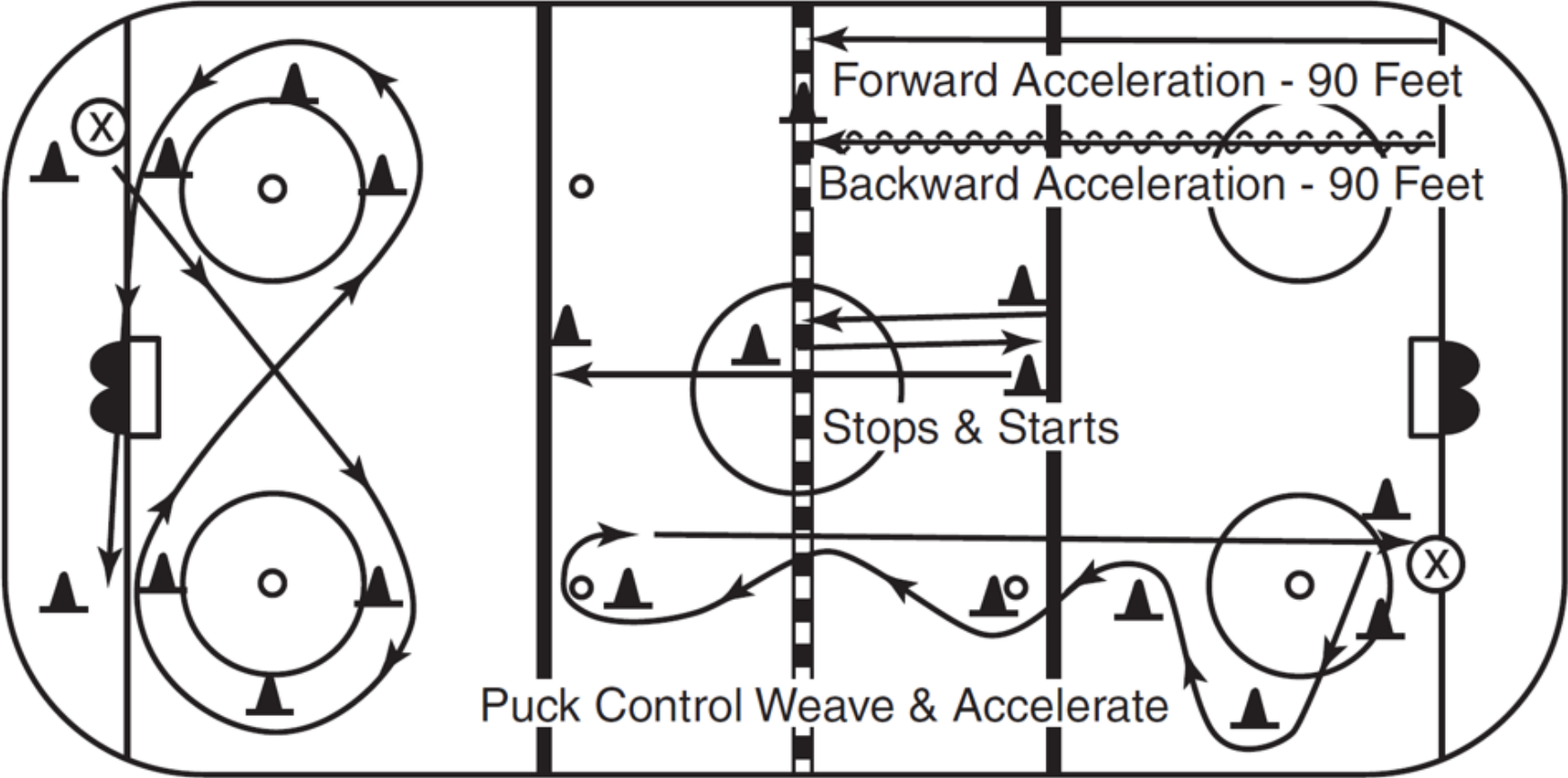


MITE/8U | EVALUATION PROCESS

Troy Pilger

- Saturday 11/1 and Sunday 11/2 @ RCC
- Player attends one session each day
- Players will be evaluated using the MN Hockey HEP (Hockey Education Program) skill drills
- Players will be put through 5 skill drills and timed by coaches
- Players have two attempts at the drills both days; only the best time is recorded for each drill each day
- The best times from all 5 drills will be added up and the totals will be used to place players on teams
- Coaches will be asked to repeat Eval drill times at end of season

EVALS | MITE/8U

- **Purpose:** evaluate players to create teams with similar experience and abilities

MITE/8U | TEAM PLACEMENT

- Team breakdown
 - Mites 4 levels (Levels 1-4, one team at each level)
 - 8U 2 levels (Levels 1 & 2)
- As of tonight, we are planning on four mite teams and two 8U teams; may change if more kids register
- Each team will have a set of goalie equipment and all players will be allowed to try it at least once

KNOCK THE RUST OFF | MITE/8U

- **Purpose:** get Mite and 8U kids on ice prior to evals and run through eval skills
- Free event hosted by RAHA
- 3 sessions available on weekend of Oct 25 and 26 at RCC

 - 8:30am – Last name A-I
 - 9:45am – Last name J-O
 - Sunday, Oct 26th at RCC
 - 11:00am – Last name P-Z

HECC HELMET STICKER

- USA Hockey has mandated for over 30 years that youth players wear a HECC approved helmet
- HECC sticker on players helmets must be up to date (expiration date should be current)
 - Be extra aware of the Expiration Date; most used helmets will only have 1-2 years remaining, if at all
- Must be on the helmet and legible



IP OTHER



SEASON START | TEAMS

Mark Broeders

- Each team will need one parent volunteer for team manager (earns 10 DIBs)
 - We will host an IP Manager meeting (Date TBD)
- Head coach will schedule a brief parent meeting at the start of season to discuss expectations
- Additional team bills: **Mite** & **8U** teams can ask for \$100-\$150 per player to cover additional expenses (cannot be used for alternate jerseys; no alternate jerseys allowed)
 - This should be discussed at the team's parent meeting; decision to be made by team
 - Training/development opportunities
 - Potential additional ice and/or jamborees
 - Team party/meals/gifts



POTENTIAL IP EVENTS

- **Mites:** Scrimmage between periods at Boys High School games
- **8U:** Scrimmage between periods at Girls High School games
- **Mini-Mites/6U:** Warm-ups at High School games

If/When these events are finalized, emails will be sent out to notify parents



IP OUTDOOR ICE



- **Mite/8U Girls & Mini-Mite/6U Girls**
 - **A fun, extra time to be on the ice with your team**
 - **Starts mid-December, runs until the city rinks are no longer maintained**
 - **Coaches determine if weather and rinks are skateable**
 - **Managers email team the day of scheduled outdoor ice to announce if the practice is still on**

IP EXTRA | Mini/6U/Mite/8U

- 60 min 4x4 scrimmages at RCC (half ice)
- Starts in the beginning of December, runs 10 weeks, Friday nights
- 13 kids per team (4 teams = 52 total players)
- 1 8U girls team, 1 Mini-Mite/6U team, 2 Mite teams
- \$250/skater
- Parent helpers on the bench (let the coaches watch!)
- Team manager needed for each team (10 hours of DIBs)
- Referees (older kids in RAHA)
 - They will miss calls; treat them with respect!

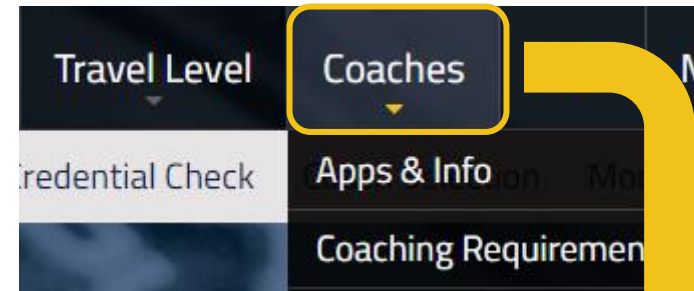

This year's coaches applications for Travel level will be open from August 1st to September 15, 2024.

IP coaches applications will be open on September 15, 2024.

NEW THIS YEAR

The coaching application process will require that ALL coaching applicants (Head and Assistant) have the following items completed **BEFORE** the application submission:

1. SAFESPORT TRAINING
2. BACKGROUND CHECK
3. AGE LEVEL MODULES
4. CONCUSSION TRAINING

Please understand that applying/registering to be a coach within RAHA does not guarantee you will be selected. However, having too many people willing to volunteer their time is a good problem and we welcome anyone to apply as a coach! We are separating the application process for coaches and traveling level evaluators. If you are interested in evaluating any of the traveling levels, please complete the Evaluator Application form on the Tryout page. Completing the Coach Application will not include you in the evaluator selection process.

COACHING | REQUIREMENTS

- **Every Head AND Assistant coach** – complete the RAHA Coach Registration Form on the Coaches Page – this is how coaches are added to the RAHA roster and how we collect USA Hockey numbers to import into the portal.
- If you coached any level in 2024-2025, you can check your background screening expiration date on the coaches tab of our website – **do not email registrar to ask.**
- SafeSport is required every year BEFORE getting on the ice. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Age Level Modules – check what you need here - <https://cepsearch.usahockey.com/>
- CEP always expires on Dec 31; register for a class now, they are hard to find in December. ALL 8 & Under coaches are required to be Level 1 certified – expired CEP is okay until you move up to Squirts/10's



COACHING

- Coaches will NOT receive DIBS if their Age Level Module or CEP credentials are incomplete on 12/31.

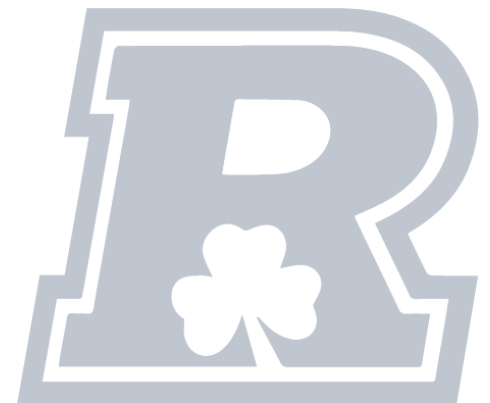

- Every IP team needs a parent manager
- Team manager receive 10 hours towards DIBs
 - Only 10 hours are allocated for managers for each team
 - If there is more than 1 team manager, those individuals split the 10 DIBs hours
- Manager requirements:
 - All managers must register for USA Hockey, take the Safe Sport certification course and complete a background screening



MANAGERS

- Manager duties (high level list):
 - Weekly team communications
 - Updating team page on RAHA website
 - Scheduling events: jamborees, scrimmages
 - Managing team budgets (Mite/8u)
 - Additional ice purchases or ice swaps
 - Assist at team picture day
 - Help plan team gatherings
 - Association engagement coordination
