Senior Jeremiah Cabuyaban sent in Palmer Holst and Grant Littrell for scores in the seventh with a ground ball double to left field.

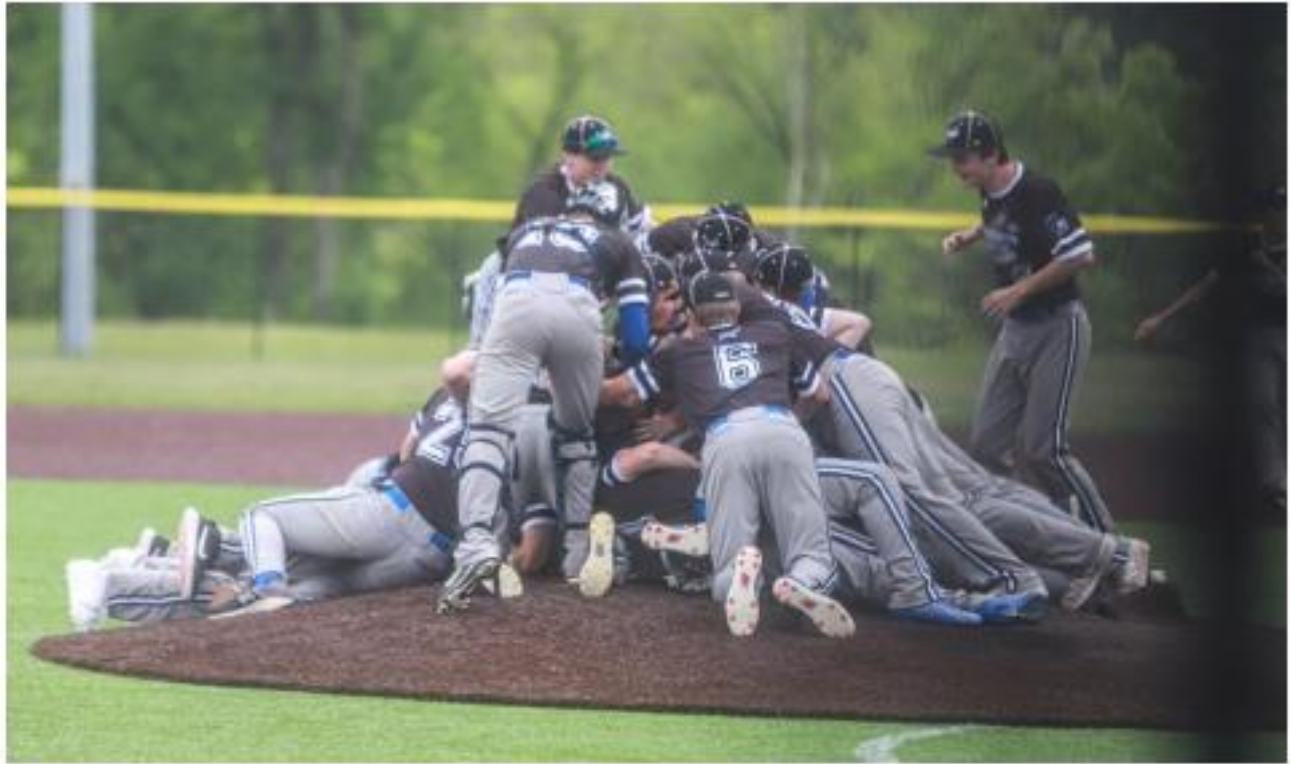

Watson said the team's confidence level never wavered and the Jays took control with that inning.

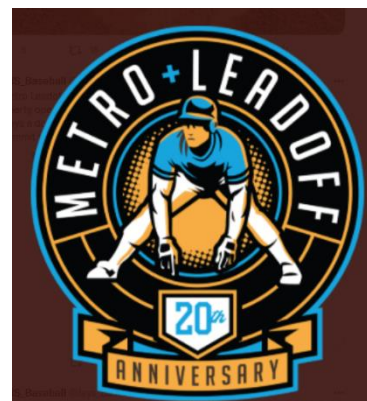
"It just felt great because after that, we didn't look back," Watson said.

Liberty baseball beat CBC, advance to state final

LIBERTY – Liberty baseball earned a spot in the state finals with a 8-2 victory over Christian Brothers College Friday, June 4, at U.S. Ballpark in Ozark.

The Jays built up a 4-2 lead, which looked modest compared to the team's large advantage in hits, before breaking through with a four-run seventh inning to put the game away.

Liberty got on the board first when junior Jeremiah Cabuyaban hit a sacrifice grounder where Cadets third baseman Ayden Robinson-Wayne opted for a throw to first while Jays senior Dawson Goe crossed home for the score.

CBC responded with two runs over the first two innings, including Nick Zanetello powering a solo homer over the outfield wall.

Bennett said the early scoring for the Cadets did not rattle him. He focused on keeping the ball low and trusting his defense to make plays if he forced weak contact from the batters.

Despite this being his first season playing for the Jays, Bennett said already had enough opportunities in high-pressure moments to feel comfortable on this big stage.

"We all just have to have the right mindset going into it," Bennett said. "Our lineup is really good 1 through 9. If I give up a few runs, I know that they're going to come pick me up."

Bennett proved prophetic as he kept the Cadets off the board through the next three and two-thirds innings, limiting his opposition to four hits during that stretch. He finished with four strikeouts. Junior Karson Milbrandt entered the game for the final four outs, picking up two strikeouts and did not allow a single batter to reach a base.

During that time, the Jays churned out constant offense despite going four innings with only two runs, the second coming off a line-drive double from senior Ryan Williams in the third inning. The Jays left five runners on base and had numerous others get tagged out as the team stayed aggressive and kept the pressure on the Cadets defense.

Liberty remained tied 2-all with a 7-2 advantage in hits through four innings. The team earned six more hits as they scored six unanswered runs the rest of the way.

Senior Aiden Watson put a sacrifice fly into left field that allowed sophomore Chase Littrell to score the go-ahead run.

Williams got in the action again by sending home sophomore Addison Smith with a single on a line drive to right field.

Liberty head coach Kirk Bragg said Williams was clutch for the Jays. Williams went 0 for 4 from the plate in the state quarterfinals against Raymore-Peculiar, but he went 4 for 4 with four RBIs against the Cadets.

"He didn't have his best performance against Ray-Pec, but we know we're going to stick with him," Bragg said. "Coming in and doing what he did today, that's nothing but senior leadership."

That performance came in a game where the offense was producing hits but not quite executing the game plan to get runners in scoring position. Liberty opted for more comfort in the final frame when they exploded for four runs in the top of the seventh.

Watson started the scoring barrage with a line-drive single to left field, sending Littrell in for the score. Williams wrapped up his four-RBI day by sending Smith and Goe home on a single with a hard ground ball to right field.

Williams said he saw the ball really well during the game.

"I tried to stay patient in the counts, not getting myself out too early and wait for him to put something in the zone," Williams said.

Cabuyaban finished off the scoring barrage with a sacrifice to the pitcher that allowed Watson to cross home plate.

Liberty added to its all-time high season win total in program history by moving to 31-9 on the year. The Jays have reached the state final for the first time since doing so a decade ago.

The Jays kept the celebrations to a minimum after putting themselves one game away from a state title.

"We want to stay as relaxed as possible," Williams said. "We know we've got a big one tomorrow."

Liberty will face Fort Zumwalt West in the state championship game at 6:30 p.m. Saturday, June 5, at U.S. Baseball Park in Ozark.

The Jaguars dismantled Jefferson City 11-0 in their semifinal matchup following the Jays victory. Ft. Zumwalt West scored all of their runs in the first two innings and earned the run-rule victory in a five-inning game.

Liberty baseball takes state championship with win over Ft. Zumwalt West

LIBERTY – Liberty baseball found a way to maintain all of its momentum from the end of its semifinal as it shell-shocked the top-ranked Missouri Class 6 team in Ft. Zumwalt West in the early going.

The Jays built a five-run lead after two innings Saturday, June 5, and never relinquished control in an 8-4 win over the Jaguars at U.S. Baseball Park in Ozark.

The win marked Liberty's second state title in program history. The Blue Jays won their first in 2002 and finished runner-up in 2011 before taking third in 2012.

Liberty head coach Kirk Bragg said this was a team where he knew early in the season that they had a lot of the necessary parts to make a deep run, but he wasn't entirely sure if they would put it all together.

"Then something just clicked," Bragg said. "They bought into everything we were doing, system ball. Then the pitching started working and we just started beating teams that I thought were really good. It just kept rolling."

Liberty finished the year on a 10-game win streak and earned postseason victories over the top two ranked Class 6 teams in the Missouri High School Baseball Coaches Association's final regular season poll.

The Jays beat No. 2-ranked Liberty North in the district championship game, taking three season victories to one against their crosstown rival that finished 28-6 on the season. The team also beat the Class 5 runner-up Grain Valley twice in the regular season.

"It's just so special," Bragg said. "Special for not only the players, but for the community, the parents, (team photographer) Eric Langhorst. All the people that have spent all this time and effort on these guys."

The Jays arrived for the state final loose and relaxed after they advanced past the semifinal with a 4-run final inning to seal an 8-4 victory over Christian Brothers College. Bragg said the players were chanting and rapping loud enough to shake the bus as they pulled into the parking lot.

They needed to maintain that energy for nearly half a day as their championship game started three hours behind schedule and ended up concluding after midnight on Sunday.

Liberty seemed to stay right on schedule. The Jays soared out to seven runs in the first two innings as the team took a commanding lead and never looked back.

Liberty's first three batters made it on base in the bottom of the first inning before senior Ryan Williams grounded into a double play, sending sophomore Addison Smith in for the score. A double steal got senior Dawson Goe home for a run while putting junior Jeremiah Cabuyaban into scoring position on second.

Junior Palmer Holst made it 3-0 as he sent Cabuyaban around the bases on a pop-fly single to left field.

Zumwalt West looked like it might be able to turn the game into a high-scoring affair when the Jaguars scored two runs on a two-out, bases-loaded single in the top of the second inning.

But the Jays answered right back with an impressive showing in the bottom half of the inning.

Senior Grant Littrell turned a walk into a scoring threat as he stole second and third. Smith join him in scoring position thanks to a walk and reaching second on a fielder's choice bunt from Goe. Senior Aiden Watson took advantage as he blasted a line-drive double to right field to send Littrell and Smith home.

The Jaguars tagged Watson on a rundown between second and third following a grounder from Williams, but an error trying to pick up the double play at second allowed Williams to score as the ball sailed into the outfield.

Junior Brock Toney surrendered two more runs in the fourth inning as Liberty's lead got trimmed to 7-4, but momentum for Zumwalt West disappeared before the Jays ever returned to the plate.

After a bang-bang play resulted in a Jags out at first base, the umpires ejected the team's first-base coach Ryan Oetting for crossing the base line to argue the call. Zumwalt West head coach Eric Gough quickly earned an ejection as well.

The coaching changes likely would not have mattered as Bragg opted to put junior Karson Milbrandt on the mound, starting with the final out in the fourth. Toney finished his day with one strikeout, allowing four runs and six hits over just short of four innings.

Milbrandt looked loose from the moment he got off the bus and that did not change when he entered the game. Any chance for Milbrandt to feel pressure heading into his second day of closer duties disappeared when Liberty took the five-run lead after the second inning.

"I knew that was game," Milbrandt said. "Toney is a dog and our offense just kept rolling."

Milbrandt utilized a combination of power and control, refusing to let the Jags close the gap created in the first four innings. He kept the bases clear through the fifth and sixth innings as he earned three strikeouts.

Milbrandt gave up his second hit to start the top of the seventh before the next batter hit into a fielder's choice at short stop. Smith opted for the out at second. The last batter hit into a double play for Goe at second.

Goe, who also scored the Jays final run in the bottom of the sixth by stealing home for the second time in the game, beat the runner with a throw to Watson at first and earned the final out to secure the state championship.

The sound of the ball hitting Watson's glove cued the Jays to start a bee line for the mound. Milbrandt became the bottom of the Jays dog pile and senior Keaton O'Connor became the final leaper at the top of the pile after he arrived from left field.

Liberty also pushed their record for most wins in a season to 32 with their state championship victory. The team broke the previous mark of 28 that had been set during multiple seasons, including when these outgoing seniors were freshmen in 2019.

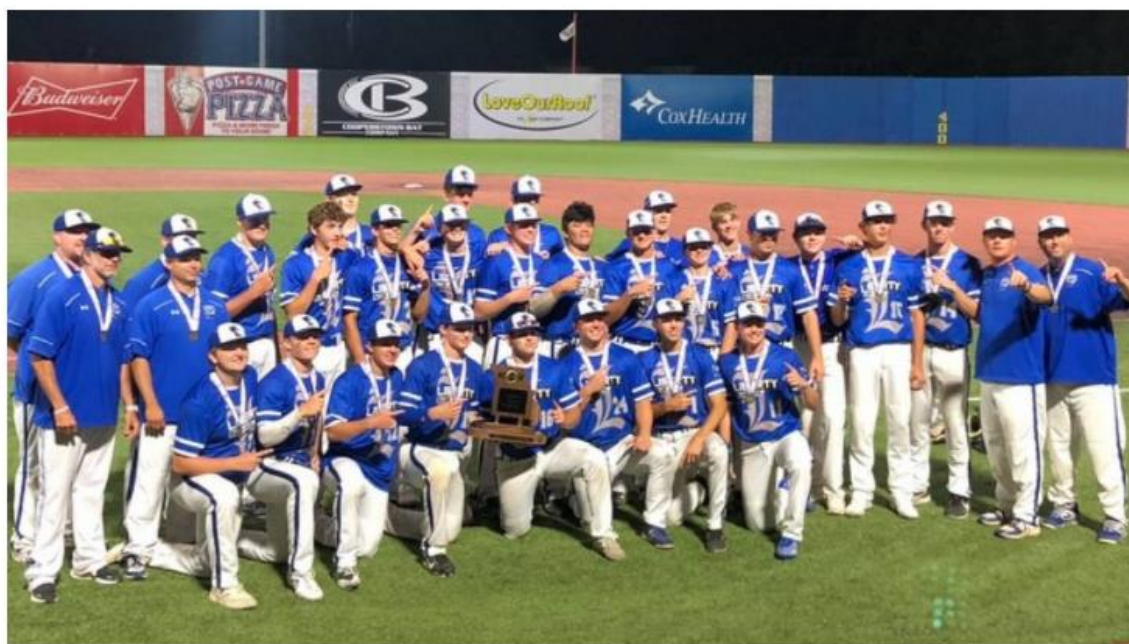
Liberty senior class of Watson, Williams, Goe, Littrell, O'Connor, Justin Agnor, Caleb Cahill, Jason Cross, and Colin Stanfield will have the rare honor of finishing their high school careers on a state championship win.

"It's the greatest feeling ever," Watson said. "It's my last game ever as Blue Jay and we've been dreaming of this for the past four years. We finally got it done."

The game concluded after the stroke of 12 a.m. with a line-out to second and the Blue Jays doubling off a Fort Zumwalt West runner.

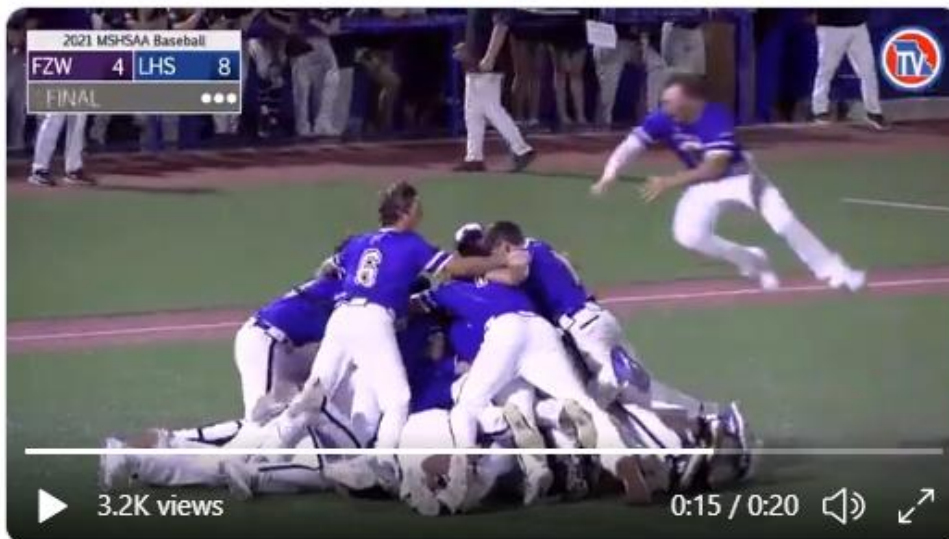

Jeremiah Cabuyaban then walked and stole second with two outs as the runner on third, Dawson Goe, raced home for a second run. Liberty added one more in the frame when Palmer Holst singled home Cabuyaban.

Fort Zumwalt got two runs back in the second on a single. Goe laid down a bunt that scored a run in the second, and Aiden Watson doubled home two more to make it 6-2 Liberty.

Williams lined one to third, then wound up scoring a seventh run during a wild sequence that included a throwing error by Fort Zumwalt West.

Fort Zumwalt West put two more runs on the board in the fourth, but they were the last they'd score.

Liberty's final run came in the sixth on a passed ball.

The Kirk Bragg-coached Blue Jays flexed their muscles at the plate in winning this championship. On Friday, Liberty beat Christian Brothers College 8-2 in the Class 6 semifinals.

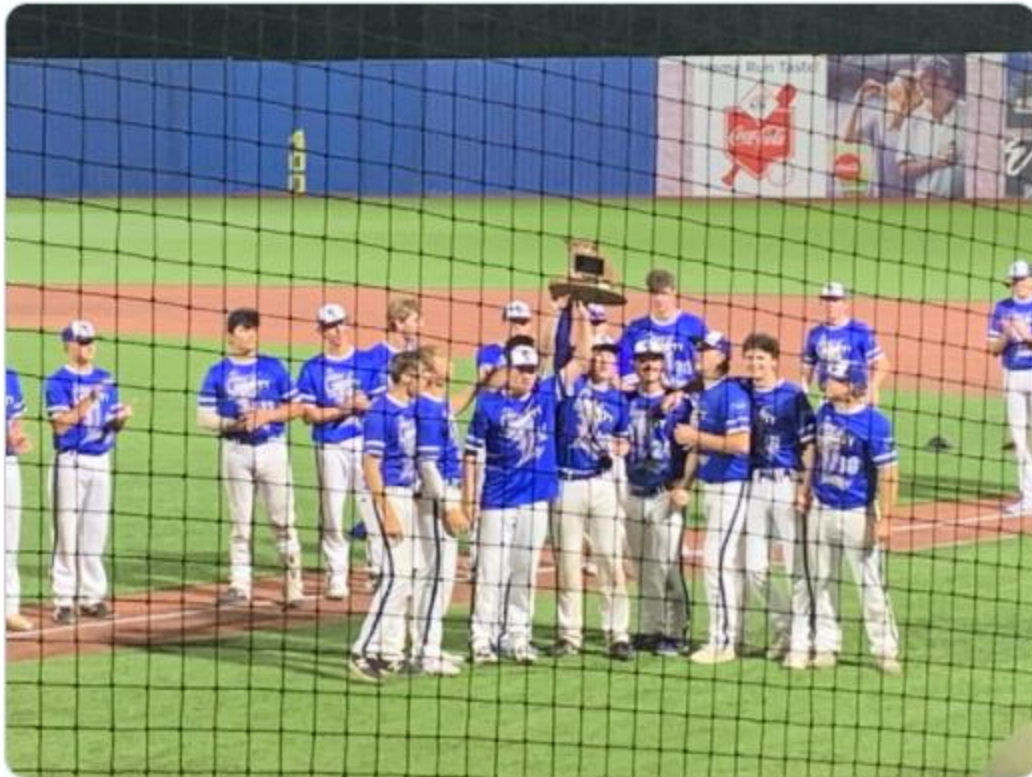

LIBERTY, Mo. — The dream season for the Liberty High Blue Jays baseball team had some rocky roads.

“In the middle of that season, there's a rough patch,” senior Aiden Watson said Tuesday. “We lost a couple games that we should have won.”

Then, according to fellow senior Grant Littrell, “everything clicked,” helping the Jays collect a program record 32 wins and Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA) Class 6 state title.

“This team's bond and how they approach the game is just really unprecedented,” head coach Kirk Bragg said. “These guys got rewarded for everything they did. Credit goes 100% to the players.”

Liberty defeated Fort Zumwalt West, 8-4, in the state title game late Sunday night, claiming the program's first championship since 2002.

“It's gonna be up there forever,” Watson said of bringing another title back to his high school. “To say that was your last game. And we actually won state... that's pretty special.”

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Liberty was scheduled to play a state championship at 6:30, instead, they started at 9:30.

“We just had to sit around all day, but we stayed ready, we were ready to go once we got out there,” senior catcher, Ryan Williams said. “Our assistant coach got us all Reign (Energy Drink) and we were really ready to go, all pumped up.”

But finally, when midnight struck, Liberty was announced as the Class 6 state champions.

“Just to have this opportunity to go down there and win this thing, it's special, not only to the players, but also our community,” Head Coach Kirk Bragg said.

It was a first for Liberty since 2002, a first for the KC area to have a champion in Missouri since 2007, after an 8-4 win over Ft. Zumwalt West. It was particularly nice to beat two St. Louis area teams.

“They were really loud, they were trying to get in our heads a little bit, they were playing small ball, but we had to adjust to that, we had to work really hard in practice,” Williams said.

The season started out slow, seven members of the team didn't join until 3 weeks into the season due to winter sports success, then the postseason being one and done from the opening round.

“Can't really look pass it, because every team that you play, your season could be over. And you have to grind out 6 straight wins,” Coach Bragg said. “That is really difficult.”

But for a team that feels like a Cinderella story, ending just past midnight, fits.

10 area baseball players named to Missouri all-state teams

Five area baseball players earned all-state first team honors from the Missouri High School Baseball Coaches Association while five others earned all-state recognition on either the second team or honorable mention.

The Jays received ample recognition for their Missouri Class 6 state title run with five players receiving all-state honors, including three first team selections.

Junior Karson Milbrandt and seniors Aiden Watson and Ryan Williams made all-state first team for their performances this season and during a postseason run where Liberty beat each opponent by at least three runs.

Milbrandt earned his spot as pitcher with his 2.38 ERA this season. He piled up 69 strikeouts on his way to 10 wins this season. He earned Suburban Gold all-conference first team honors.

Milbrandt truly set himself apart with elite performances in the postseason, including as the Jays closer in both of the team's state final four games. He earned 7 strikeouts while allowing just two runs over nearly eight innings during the final three state games.

Watson made all-state as Liberty's first baseman. He racked up 50 hits on a .431 batting average and drove in 32 runs. He increased his batting average to .529 on 17 plate appearances during the postseason. Watson was also named first team for Suburban Gold all-conference.

Williams played six different positions for the Jays, but he earned his all-state spot for his work at catcher. He earned Suburban Gold all-conference first team honors as utility thanks to his versatility. Williams set a school record with 53 hits as he averaged .414 at the plate, leading the Jays with 36 RBI.

Junior Jeremiah Cabuyaban shared the catcher role with Williams and did well enough to get himself a spot on the all-state second team at that position. Cabuyaban, who also earned all-conference second team at catcher. He drove in 27 runs and earned 28 hits with eight going for extra bases.

Sophomores Kai Bennett and Addison Smith landed on the all-state second team. Both players also received Suburban Gold all-conference honorable mentions honors this season.

Bennett earned five wins in 11 starts with a 2.09 ERA for the Jays. Bennett started the team's state semifinals game against Christian Brothers College, picking up four strikeouts and staving off two early runs to hold the Cadets scoreless through his final four innings.

Smith made all-state as an infielder. The shortstop earned 40 hits and drove in 18 runs with a .342 batting average. He led the Jays with 79 assists over 251.7 innings, which was the fifth most on the team despite this being Smith's first year of high school baseball.

The Jays had six more players who made the Suburban Gold all-conference teams. Senior pitcher Justin Agnor and junior outfielder Palmer Holst made the second team. Senior first baseman Dawson Goe, sophomore outfielder Grant Littrell, junior pitcher Brock Toney and junior pitcher Ben Sundell earned honorable mention.

Karson Milbrandt, Liberty

Milbrandt gave the Jays an elite closer in both his state final four outings on the way to the state title, but he was not too shabby as a starter throughout the season. He piled up 69 strikeouts on his way to 10 wins this season. He earned 7 strikeouts while allowing just two runs over nearly eight innings during the final three state games.

Ryker Edwards, Smithville

Edwards did not miss a beat despite missing out on having a freshman campaign in 2020. His first season with the Warriors on the diamond included top three marks for single-season hits, RBI and home runs in program history. He also tied for the highest program wins mark with 7 as he picked 42 strikeouts in just under 38 innings.

Ryan Williams, Liberty

Williams provided senior leadership at catcher as he earned all-state first team honors in his role. He set a school record with 53 hits as he averaged .414 at the plate, leading the Jays with 36 RBI.

The senior first baseman actually played even better from the plate in the postseason, increasing his batting average to .529 on 17 plate appearances.
