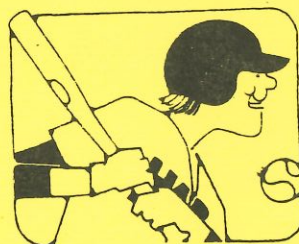
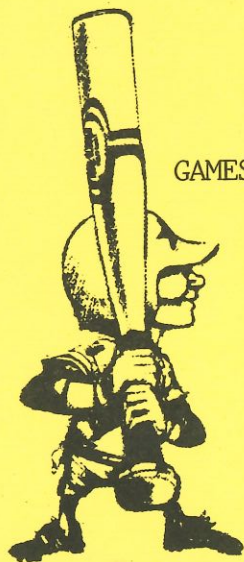

RESERVATIONS FOR TWO

Confused? Don't know where you're headed? Well, with only one week remaining in regular season play, six of the eight playoff positions have been claimed. A glance at the standings will affirm those teams which already have qualified. For the remaining four teams in the race, alas, there are only reservations for two.

The most important of last week's limited action involved the YANKEES' (first team to finish) rise to the top of the American Division. Unless ZAPPED! can pull a hat trick on Sunday, the Yanks will stay there. Another squad whose fortune was radically altered is RHYTHM, who are down but certainly not out. Why, even Elliot Mevorah's men can explode from sixth into the playoffs with the right combination of wins and losses throughout the league.

Though they may seem peculiar, the standings are in fact correct. ZIP is only $\frac{1}{2}$ game back, but still are in third place by winning percentage, behind ZAPPED!, who hasn't even clinched. Likewise, TIME TO EXPLODE may be in last, but they do not have to stay there. Would you really expect perfect order in such an unpredictable league?

As far as prediction goes, here is a brief rundown of how each of the remaining teams may qualify for the post-season extravaganza!

ZAPPED! Qualifies: - if they win any of their three remaining games

ANGELS Qualify: - if they win two of their remaining three
- if they win one of their remaining three, but RHYTHM loses its last game and TIME TO EXPLODE loses any of their remaining three

RHYTHM Qualifies: - if they win their game against ZAPPED! and ZAPPED! loses its other two games

- if they win and the ANGELS lose two of their remaining three

TIME TO EXPLODE Qualifies: - if they win all three of their remaining games and RHYTHM loses its game and the ANGELS lose two of their three remaining games

So while the ANGELS and ZAPPED! are in the most comfortable positions because they can control their own fate regardless of other goings on, RHYTHM and TIME TO EXPLODE can be expected to move right in if either slips up. Also notice that since RHYTHM and the ANGELS play ZAPPED!, possible outcomes are simplified - if one team wins, the other must

lose. Therefore, it may be harder than it seems for ZAPPED! to win a game, going against teams who must win with their backs to the wall.

AROUND THE LEAGUE.....

After tucking make-up win over ROLLERS under their belt, the YANKEES won a dramatic bottom of the seventh contest against the DIRTY DOZEN...trailing 2-0, the YANKEES were able to cut down a DOZEN attempt for a homer by Yogi Kassin after a gapper in left center. Yogi, going all the way with two outs, was a victim of a perfect relay - Jason Cohen to Ikey Dweck to Charles Saka...but in the "What the Lord taketh, the Lord also giveth away" department, Yogi earlier was made present of the winning blow in DOZEN's game versus RHYTHM...Yogi's pop-up turned into a triple and the game's only runs in a 3-0 decision...THRILLER riding real hot streak, only team in league to own both two digit number of wins and three digit number of runs scored...KAMIKAZE victory over YANKS made possible by Louis Hoffstein's solid performance. Louis filled in at leftfield in a pinch, stroked a double, and scored two runs in one inning...Morris Chera has made move to third with ease; Morris has played every infield position in his career except for shortstop. Not bad for an outfielder, huh?...Morris, himself, was robbed by a great running catch by Lawley Kassin to keep KAMIKAZE lead safe...ANGELS-ZIP 2-0 affair will be picked up in the top of the third.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: ISAAC BETESH

In an otherwise slow day, Isaac provided the most exciting moment when he drove in the tying and winning runs with a line drive double in the YANKEES' 3-2 victory over the DIRTY DOZEN. The hit came with two outs and may have given the YANKS the American Division title. Isaac also played a good rightfield and had three other hits on the day, as he has stepped in and contributed to this team from the moment he was acquired.
