



Dear WSCC Ice Arena Patrons,

We are excited about reopening the WSCC Ice Arena on Wednesday, September 9th! Our team is looking forward to seeing your smiling faces once again and we are working hard to make sure that we provide you with the most care and precautions possible as you prepare to use our facility again!

We appreciate your patience as we phase-in parts of our facility so that we may provide a safe environment for all. Please do not hesitate to reach out to our staff if you have questions. We will do our best to keep you informed on any changes as they occur.

What Are Our Staff Members Doing?

- ❖ Daily health screenings of our employees for symptoms of COVID-19.
- ❖ Following the CDC's guidelines for hand washing practices.
- ❖ Staff will be wearing face coverings or masks based on the information and guidelines set forth by the State of Michigan.
- ❖ The facility will be cleaned, disinfected and sanitized each night using enhanced cleaning methods recommended by the CDC.
- ❖ Our staff will be increasing the frequency of disinfecting high traffic/touch surfaces and locker rooms with EPA approved disinfectants and using enhanced cleaning equipment.
- ❖ Maintaining a social distance of at least 6 feet from patrons.
- ❖ Limiting facility capacity.
- ❖ Encouraging patrons to be respectful of each other.

What Can You Do?

- Please do not come into the facility if you are feeling ill or experiencing symptoms related to COVID-19.
- Based on the Executive Order from the State of Michigan that mandates masks be worn in indoor facilities, patrons will be required to wear face masks that cover nose and mouth in all areas of the facility.
- Wash your hands frequently and/or use the hand sanitizers after touching surfaces.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Maintain a social distance of 6 feet or more from other patrons where possible.
- Respect your fellow patrons.

Team Practices

- ❖ Due to limitations on our facility capacity we are asking our patrons the following requests:
 - Skaters: Please when your ice time is done, come off the ice and get ready to leave as soon as possible.
 - Parents/Non-Participants: We are recommending, when bringing your skater to practices, have one parent bring them to the rink when possible.
 - We are following the MDHHS guidelines for seating capacity of 20%.

- ❖ Please do not arrive more than 30 minutes before ice time.
- ❖ Upon arrival head directly to the locker room, avoid loitering in the lobby. We are strongly encouraging players to come dressed in most their gear, with the exception of skates.
- ❖ After event get undressed in a timely manner, no hanging out in the lobby.
- ❖ Locker rooms:
 - We will provide each team with 2 locker rooms to help provide social distancing guidelines where possible
 - Locker rooms will have social distancing markers placed on the floor to help with determining the proper distance.
- ❖ Ice Arena staff will disinfect locker rooms in between games before next team enter.

Games

- ❖ MAHA's Return the Play Standards will be our reference for all USA Hockey Sanctioned games and events.
- ❖ Spectators: We will follow MDHHS recommendation of 20% capacity for all games, masks are required and social distancing should be followed.
- ❖ Please do not arrive more than 45 minutes before ice time.
- ❖ Upon arrival head directly to the locker room, avoid congregating in the lobby. If for some reason locker room is not available, there is room at the east end of the lobby for 2 teams to socially distance while they wait.
- ❖ After event, get undressed in a timely manner, please do not hang out in the lobby.
- ❖ Locker rooms:
 - We will provide each team with 2 locker rooms to help provide social distancing guidelines where possible
 - Locker rooms will have social distancing markers placed on the floor to help with determining the proper distance.
- ❖ We will have no concessions available to comply with EO 176.
- ❖ Ice Arena staff will disinfect locker rooms in between games before next team enters.

Public Activities

- ❖ No public activities or events will be allowed per Executive Order 176. This includes, but not limited to, open skates, drop in hockey, stick and pucks, freestyle and birthday parties.
