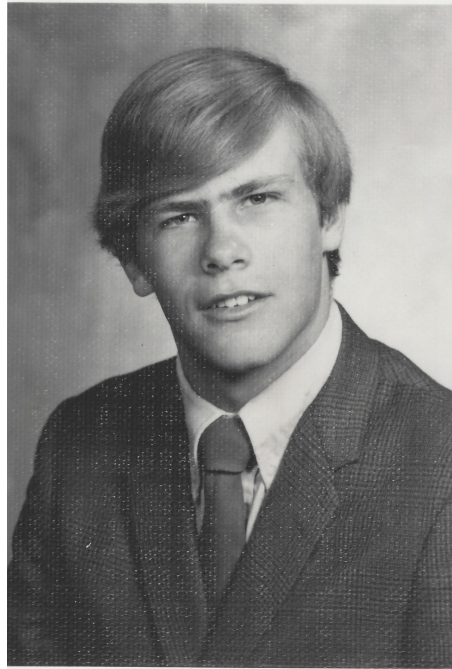

Tim "Corny" Cornwell
CLASS OF 1973

Tim was a seven-time letter winner at Park, participating in football, hockey, track, and baseball. He earned All-Conference honors in hockey and his baseball team won a conference championship. Tim was named to the first-ever high school all-star hockey team.

Tim went on to play hockey at the University of Minnesota for one year during which time they won their first national title. Tim finished his college career at Hamline University where he lettered for three years, set the all-time leading scoring record and was named to the MIAC All-Conference Honorable Mention team.

Following college, Tim spent a year playing professional hockey in Sweden. Upon returning to the US, Tim became the head coach of the Edison High School hockey team for four years earning Edison's first conference championship. Tim was named Minneapolis City Conference Coach of the Year. From Edison High School Tim returned to Hamline as a head coach for both hockey and soccer, an assistant football coach and a sports information director. His hockey team earned an academic championship.

Gary Fehrman **COACH**

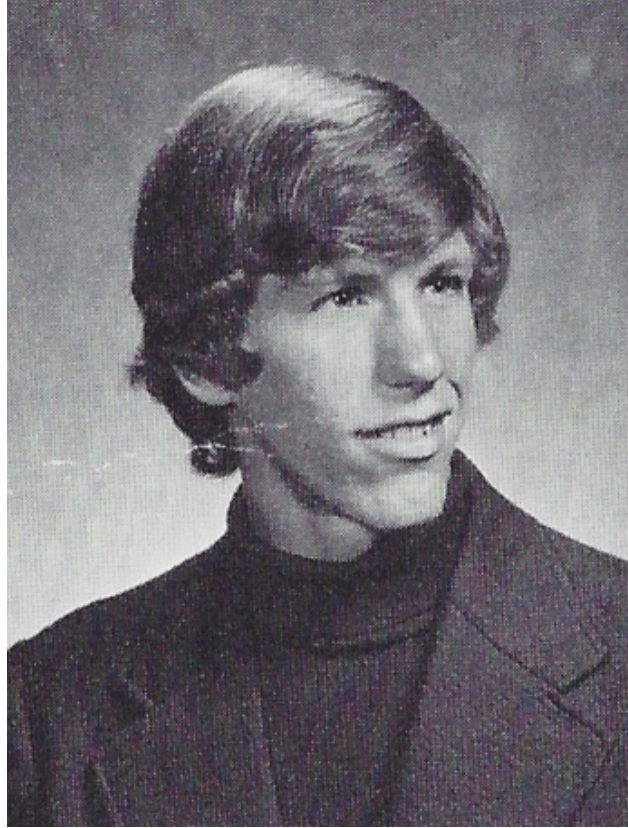
Gary was an English teacher and school counselor at Park Junior High for 14 years. When PJH closed he moved to Park High School and finished his career in the SWAS (school within a school) program as its counselor and 11th grade English instructor.

Gary coached in ISD 833 from 1968 to 1999. He was a hockey, football, track, and baseball coach during various years at Park Junior High. At Park High School, he continued coaching football, baseball, and added wrestling for 4 years. He was fortunate to work with very competent staffs and exceptional athletes. After leaving football as a coach, Gary was “trained” by Bruce Hansen to take football stats for Park. They worked together on Friday nights for many years.

Gary wants to acknowledge all of the athletes, coaches, A.D.s, friends, teachers, secretaries and staff that made his career so rewarding.

Dale Howe
CLASS OF 1974

Dale was a three-sport standout at Park participating in football, basketball and baseball. He earned All-Conference honors in basketball both junior and senior year. He was also a member of the state tournament team in 1973. Dale earned All-Conference honors in both football and baseball during his senior year. He also earned multiple scholar-athlete awards.

Following high school, Dale spent a year at St. John's University and finished up at Winona State University where he earned a BS degree.

As an adult, Dale continued to give back to the community by coaching several youth teams in the areas of soccer, baseball, softball, and basketball. In his short life, Dale influenced many children by passing on his love of sports. The outdoor basketball courts in Cottage Grove are named in his honor.

Jackie Voigt
CLASS OF 2008

Jackie is the only female athlete in the history of Park High School to earn All-State honors in three sports: soccer, basketball, and track and field. As a basketball player, Jackie was named All-Conference four times, All-American honorable mention, and a Miss Basketball finalist. She was the second player in team history to reach 1000 career points and helped the team win the Suburban East Conference title twice. In track and field, Jackie was a conference champion, a 2-time section champion and a 3-time state qualifier in the shot put. She is currently the school recorded holder. In soccer, Jackie played goalkeeper where she recorded 14 shut-outs and allowed only 6 goals. She also earned numerous academic awards and was named the St. Paul Downtown Lions Club Female Amateur Athlete of the Year.

Jackie went on to play basketball at the University of Minnesota where she served as a 2-year captain. She earned Academic All-Big Ten honors three times, the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award twice and still ranks 9th in school history in career offensive rebounds and 7th in career defensive rebounds. At the conclusion of her basketball career, Jackie played one season with the Gopher soccer team where she also earned Academic All-Big Ten honors.

Jackie is currently as assistant basketball coach at Augsburg University.

Lauren (Burks) Zidon
CLASS OF 2002

Lauren was a three-sport letter winner at Park participating in cross country, track and field and basketball. She was a state qualifier in both cross country and track all four years of high school. Lauren's highest finishes at the state meet were third place in cross country and fourth place in track in the 3200-meter run, both in her senior year. She was a four-year MVP for the cross country team and received many conference and section awards.

She continued her running career at the University of Georgia, earning multiple SEC honors in both sports including the 2002 SEC Female Athlete of the Year for cross country after becoming the first Lady Bulldog to qualify for the NCCA Championships since the team qualified in 1997. In 2003, Lauren earned All-SEC Second Team honors for cross country and, in 2006, she helped the team claim its first SEC indoor and outdoor track titles. Academically, Lauren was honor the SEC Honor Roll and received one of the SEC NCAA Postgraduate Studies Scholarship. Lauren earned a BA in Spanish and a BS in biology.

Lauren and her husband, Kelly, have three children: Will, Fiona and George.
