Director Report

Spirit of Duluth was canceled. Madison capital camp was also canceled, but looking to reschedule March 21st. The food truck went well. SAHA made \$165 (20% of profit). Overall, all teams are doing well with the COVID restrictions. Lynette at the county said there is nothing more we have to do at this time. We have had 2-3 players test positive, but the teams have been able to continue to practice due to mask use and not in close contact for 15 minutes or more. D11 (MN teams) are unable to play for a few weeks. We lost money due to registration decrease and will also lose out on high school girls renting the ice. We are going to look at renting the ice @ \$200 per hour and maximizing skaters to 10 until future notice. Although MN hockey is stating no practice/games, USA hockey is starting to play where you can. Bantam A tournament may not happen due to teams pulling out.

Treasure Report

We are down \$17K in registration, \$5600 in concession and \$19K in tournament revenue. As of current, we have had \$1700 in sock income. Chad at Holden's found a company that would save about \$5700 annually on our insurance premium.

Development

D11 came up with an emergency sub list rule, to avoid double rostering. Jr Gold currently has 31 players signed up; therefore, we are looking at two teams until potentially January when the high school starts back up. The majority of coaches are registered for the season.

Bylaws/policies

Kellen is looking at adding a line item in the bylaws for committees to submit a budget for the year and submit it to the finance committee by a certain date. It will be brought forward for approval. They will also be looping back around on the items that were discussed last year.

Jamie will be looking through the equipment room for jerseys for Jr Gold. Mite through Bantams all received their jerseys. MM reversible jerseys were bought and will be returned at the end of the year for SAHA to reuse in future years.
